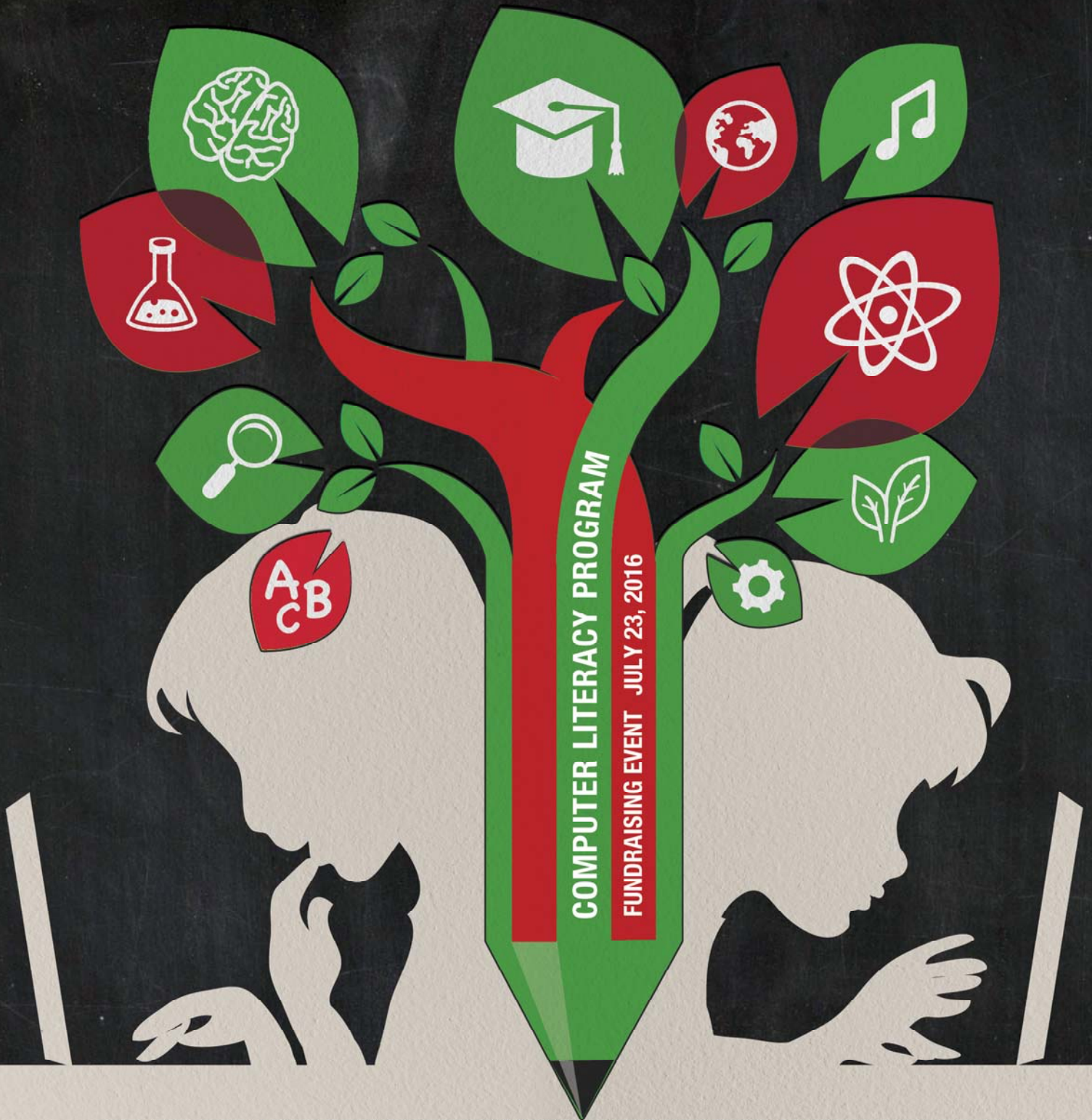

# Computer Literacy Program for the Underprivileged (2016)



## Progress through innovation

The Computer Literacy Program is on the verge of entering the teen years. Innovation has driven the growth of the program, and 2016 marks the beginning of the new **Education through Entertainment** project. The core thrust remains bridging the “digital divide” that exists between an underprivileged student in rural Bangladesh and a student from an affluent family in the nation’s capital, not to mention with a student from a developed country. The overarching goal is to complement the regular school education with general knowledge, communication skills, global awareness, environmental conscientiousness, and character building.

Our unwavering dedication is underscored by set up of 259 Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs), 157 Smart Class Rooms and 97 Associated CLCs. As of today CLP has produced over 100,000 computer literate graduates. Without taking our focus off our core activity, we do continually look for new opportunities to leverage the hardware/software and human resources we developed over the decade. As soon as Internet connection became available in any CLC locality, we provided that CLC access to the Internet, thereby connecting the center to the wide world of digital information. Our realization that without a working knowledge of everyday English our students would be at a severe disadvantage in this age of globalization, made us launch the “Computer Teaches Everyday English” in 2009. Our next innovation was the introduction of Smart Class Rooms (SCRs) aimed at making a transition from the traditional “learning-by-listening-to-lecture” mode to “learning-by-doing” and from multi-media presentations, as well. Every SCR is equipped with a laptop computer, a large screen monitor and other essential peripherals, engaging educational CDs on Mathematics, English, Science and Geography rich in color and animation, and contents derived from the Internet and other sources. Supervised by especially trained teachers, SCRs are student favorites that are transforming the educational landscape in rural Bangladesh. The focus of the new Education through Entertainment project is to educate students through entertaining activities. The students see educational videos, documentaries, or movies followed by lively participatory discussions on the subject pertaining to the presentation. The discussions are steered by a trained teacher so that students’ knowledge on the topic and verbal communication skills are sharpened.

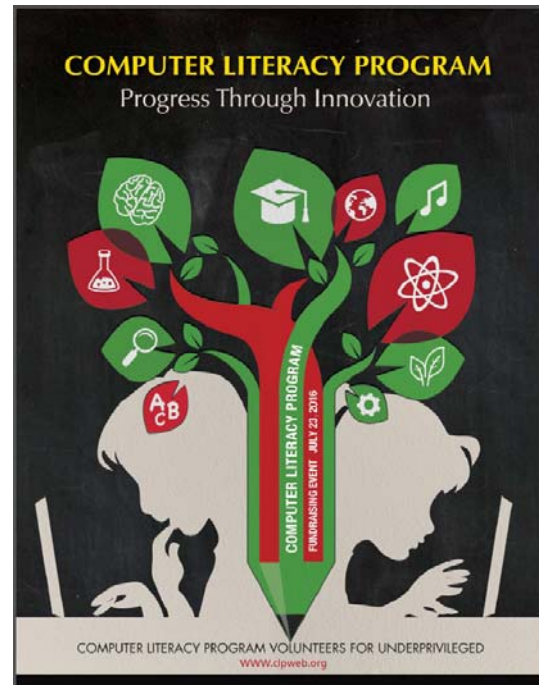

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## Tonight's distinguished speakers



*Dr. M. Zahid Hasan is a Professor and former Robert Dicke Fellow in Physics at Princeton University, Princeton, NJ. He is the Principal Investigator at the Laboratory for Topological Quantum Matter and Advanced Spectroscopy at Princeton. He is also an endowed Miller Professor (visiting) at the Institute for Basic Research at the Univ. of California at Berkeley.*

*Dr. Hasan has been a major contributor at a number of renowned physics research institutions which include Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, Berkeley, CA, Bell Laboratories, Murray Hill, New Jersey, and Stanford University & SLAC*

*National Lab, Stanford.*

*One of the outstanding achievements of Dr. Hasan is his discovery of a new particle called Weyl Fermion. This massless particle was predicted about 86 years ago by Hermann Weyl, a German Physicist, but has since escaped its detection for so many years. Dr. Hasan designed the experiment, and led an international team to the successful detection and verification of this particle. His paper was published in Science in July 16, 2015, which created an immediate sensation in the scientific community worldwide.*

*This particle is significant not only for fulfilling a theoretical prediction of the existence of a particle, but also, due to its unique characteristics, has a potential of advancing electronics and computing in the lower run. This particle could give rise to faster and more efficient electronics because of its unusual ability to behave as matter and antimatter inside a crystal, according to new research. If applied to next-generation electronics this particle could allow for a nearly free and efficient flow of electricity in electronics, and thus greater power, especially for computers, the researchers suggest.*

*Prof. Hasan has published more than 150 research papers in top referred journals, delivered more than 240 invited talks/seminars/lectures world-wide. He is listed in World's Most Influential Scientific Minds List (2014) by Thomson Reuters and ranks among 100 most cited physicists (2002-2012 and 2015).*

*Prof. Hasan's very distinguished academic achievements started early in life with his topping the combined merit list of Dhaka Board in Higher Secondary Exam in 1988. As an undergrad at the University of Texas at Austin, he became a student of Nobel Laureate Steven Weinberg, who co-discovered electroweak unification theory with Professor Abdus Salam and Professor Sheldon Glashow. Weinberg guided Prof. Hasan to study topological quantum particles which he currently pursues at Princeton University.*

# **Education and Innovation as Investment Platforms for Development in 21<sup>st</sup> Century Context**

It is an accepted notion that education leads to social and economic development. Moving beyond assertion and anecdote is important if a convincing case is to be made. However, the topic lacks quantitative research results establishing the correlation based on rigorous metrics in the context of developing economies. When public funds are limited, the “tyranny of the urgent” tends to limit such investments in favor of more time-critical direct investments. Typically assertions are made and anecdotes are given about the value of education and innovation for development. An evidence-based argument that focuses on total holistic returns of investments to development in concrete metrics is needed for informed advocacy\*.

This presentation will start with a brief survey of the global front highlighting the impact of scientifically oriented thinking, groundbreaking innovations and how they transformed global economy, geopolitics and the social sectors through the ages. The second part will focus on reviewing recent studies and quantitative analyses relating to the returns to investing in higher education covering: i) Private Market Benefits, ii) Private Non-Market Benefits, iii) Social Benefit Externalities and iv) Holistic Benefits beyond economics. Investments in human and institution capacity development are critically important allocative decisions in the development process for public and private sector decision makers in the modern context. Based on recent research results obtained by several different research institutions, I plan to highlight a framework about how to more productively view (and enhance) higher education and innovation’s role in development in the context of global issues emerging in this century.

## CLP Activity Highlights 2015-2016

The pre-teen year of the Computer Literacy Program (CLP) was one of steady and sustained growth. Progress was made in different spheres of CLP activities. The core mission of empowering underprivileged rural youths through computer literacy and technology-aided education proceeded unabated through the established Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) and Smart Class Rooms (SCRs). New initiatives were introduced and some of the older projects were overhauled. What follows is a brief overview of the key CLP activities in the year twelve since the inception of the program.

***New CLC and SCR:*** While the current focus is on sustaining and advancing the established CLCs and SCRs, one new CLC and two new SCRs were established in 2015 – 2016 operation year. These additions bring total number of CLCs to 259, associated CLCs to 97 and SCRs to 157. Geographical locations of these entities are summarized in the map displayed in page 2 (inner front cover) of this magazine.

***Graduates, graduates:*** The number of students completing the computer literacy training from the above-mentioned CLCs in this operation year stands at ~ 13,000 (more than 100,000 since the inception of the program). Seventy thousand (70,000) students benefited from SCRs this year, while the total number since the start of the SCR program is more than 170,000.

***Development of Education through Entertainment Project:*** *Education through Entertainment (EE)* is one of the two innovative projects that were initiated in the current operation year. The intent of this new initiative is to educate students through entertaining structured co-curricular activities.

The EE project leverages on the facilities of a Smart Class Room (SCR) to show students a pre-selected engaging video (or, videos depending on the length) on an interesting topic. The topics intended to be covered in the EE content library include domains of human intellectual and creative activities, such as, literature, arts, science, nature, history, geography, personalities, current events, health, and medicine, to name a few. The EE project activity is organized in structured *sessions*. The duration and format of a session is decided in consultation with school administration. A typical EE session covers two regular class periods in a school. Typically, a session is run on a Thursday after the regular classes are over.

Each session is equipped with a video (or videos) and a lesson plan to guide the teacher on how to conduct the session and steer students' activities and discussions. To date, videos and lesson plans for 14 sessions covering a variety of topics have been adapted, assembled and organized in a CD that is distributed to schools. The figure below shows an image of the Content page of the CD, which lists the titles of the sessions and the run time of the video(s). At the beginning of the session, the teacher uploads the CD on the laptop in the SCR. The content page (as shown in the Figure) comes up. The teacher clicks on the "Lesson Plan" for the session to consult instruction on how to proceed if help is needed. The Teacher is supposed to consult the lesson plan and remember the step-by-step guidance before coming to the class). After showing the video(s), the teacher opens the floor for discussion on the topic covered by the video presentation. The discussion aspects on the topic and the techniques for maximizing student participation are outlined in the Lesson Plan. The number of sessions covering additional topics will continue to grow.

The anticipated benefits of this program are: providing an engaging and enjoyable learning environment; fostering listening and comprehension skills; imparting knowledge and building awareness through entertainment; and sharpening communication skills through participatory discussions.

The pilot project has been launched in five schools with SCRs, and received enthusiastic acceptance from students and teachers. In some of the centers, students and teachers have come up with new ideas to use

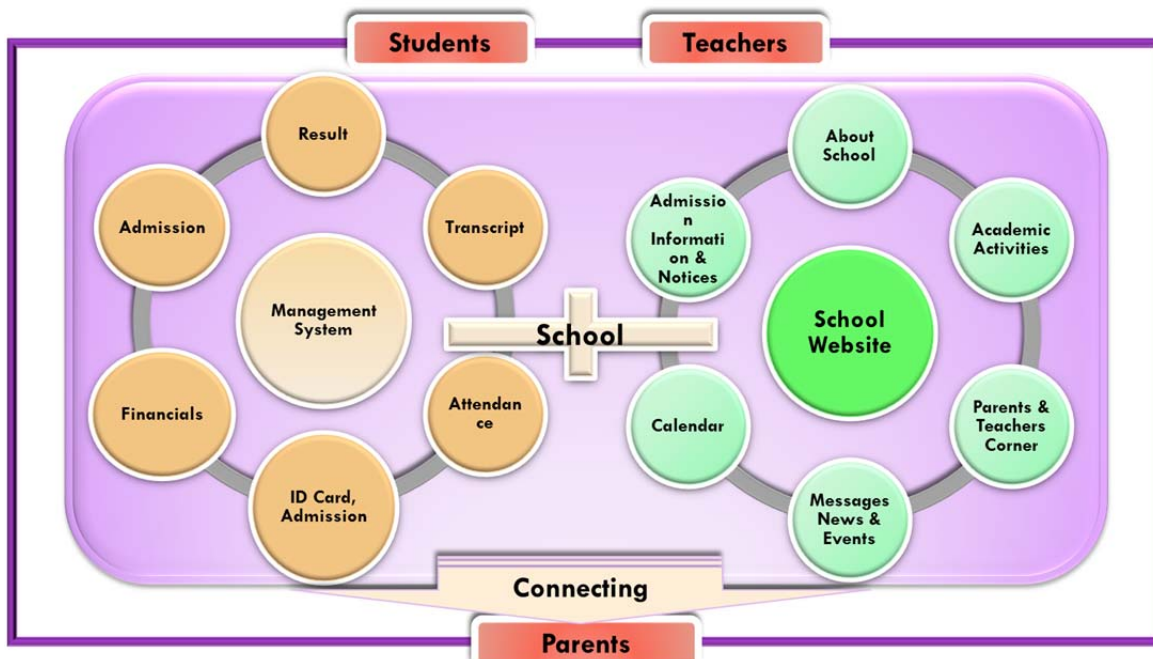

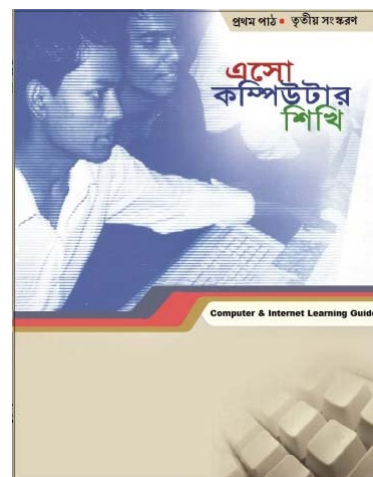
the EE contents and/or make the encounter lively. Some of schools have even shown preference to engage students with EE sessions rather than sending an alternate teacher to take the class when the regular teacher is absent. We envision the Education through Entertainment Project complement the curricular learning and pave students' path towards total education experience.

**Connecting Parents to School Project:** The second innovative program launched in this operation year is Connecting Parents to School (CPS). Educating tomorrow's citizens is an involved task that needs close participation of teachers, parents, as well as, school management and administration. In rural Bangladesh there used to be little interaction between parents and teachers, and parents' principal way of knowing how their students are doing used to be results of half-yearly and final examinations. Parent-teacher conferences used to be unheard in villages of Bangladesh. However, the 'Digital Bangladesh' initiative of the Government and wide proliferation of mobile phone technology are changing the situation significantly. Government now requires every school to have its own webpage which would be a repository of all school activities and student-related information. Dnet has developed the CPS application to connect parents to the school website via their mobile phones. Information pertaining to their respective students and school activities will be accessed through the mobile phone, and a teacher would be able to contact parents as needed. The schematic diagram below summarizes the range of activities and information contents to be handled by the CPS platform.



A pilot project to implement the CPS concept has been launched in 28 schools with CLC and 22 schools without a CLC.

**Esho Computer Shikhi (Third Edition):** “Esho Computer Shikhi” (Let us Learn Computers) has served as a unique manual for teaching and learning of basics of computers, Internet and communication technology for the underprivileged youths. Earlier editions of the manual were successfully used to provide computer and Internet literacy training to over 100,000 underprivileged students in 56 districts of Bangladesh. The students received the manual at a subsidized nominal cost (deeply discounted to make it affordable). Copies of the earlier edition ran out. The demand for the manual from students in CLCs and outside was high. The materials needed revision and expansion. An expanded, enhanced and revised third edition manuscript of the manual is now ready for printers. CLP and Dnet are looking for sponsors to fund the publication of the manuscript. A proposal soliciting funding has been prepared and is being presented to potential sponsors. Support from a sponsor is needed to make the manual (high quality) available to the students at an affordable price.



**Center Maintenance:** Maintenance and sustenance of the established CLCs and SCRs is a major cost for the program. Even when the sponsor cost shares, the program has to come up with 50% of the funding required to provide full support for a CLC. During this operation year CLP provided full maintenance to 70 CLCs for which respective sponsors participated in cost sharing arrangement. Remote monitoring and technical guidance was provided to remaining 189 CLCs and 157 SCRs without cost sharing. Hardware in quite a few of the earlier established centers required replacement. The program delivered 16 desktop and 14 laptop computers this year to the CLCs covered under the maintenance plan.

**Smart Classroom Contents Revamped:** Launched in 2009, the Smart Class Room (SCR) project has taken off. While it is desirable to teach every subject in a SCR, the initial focus was on four subjects: *Everyday English, Geography, Mathematics and Science.*

This is because student-experience-sensitive educational CDs were available on those subjects. However, the need and demand for contents and lesson plans that can accompany the NCTB (National Curriculum and Textbook Board) curricula for different grade levels was always high. In 2011 the CLP-Dnet team arranged a workshop for selected high school teachers to seek their input on the topical areas that they would prefer to teach using multi-media contents. With feedback from participants in the workshop, multimedia contents consisting of an assortment of videos, animated games, flash animations and power-point slides were developed with the help of experts for nine NCTB books covering the original four subjects and English Grammar for different grade levels (detailed in the table below).



More recently, the National Curricula and the text books were revised and a good portion of the originally developed contents did not correlate with the new text books. The need for new contents became apparent. Consequently, a research team from the Institute of Education and Research (IER) of the University of Dhaka was consulted in 2015 to map out the existing NCTB books and determine how many modules originally developed in 2011 were still useable and delineate the need for new modules. The findings of this research are summarized in the Table below. Guided by this need analysis the team produced the required new multimedia teaching modules (some developed in-house and most others adapted from open source), as listed in the table below.

The team also developed detailed step-by-step lesson plans for each period for each of the nine subjects to guide the teachers on how to conduct the class and to communicate with the students. Some lesson plans contain more-than-one multimedia content and some do not contain any. A computer CD containing teaching contents encompassing four regular subjects covering multiple classes as well as lesson plans for each textbook as described in the table has been produced for use by the teachers. This CD (as shown in the picture at the beginning of this section) was mailed in 2016 to all schools with SCRs.

It is gratifying that from the very inception the resources of CLCs were leveraged by educational institutions to further learning and training of not only their students but also students from other institutions that did not have computers. Again the CLCs are being used by some schools not only to pursue CLP-designed computer literacy training, but also to run their computer classes (per the NCTB curricula) enabling the students to receive practical exposure to computers. Over 170,000 students benefited from such use of the CLC facilities. CLP started out and remains an enabler of computer and technology-aided education in rural Bangladesh.

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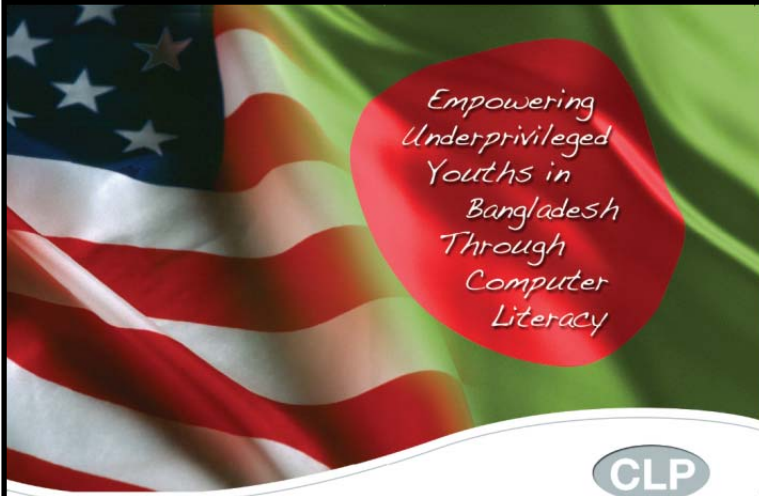

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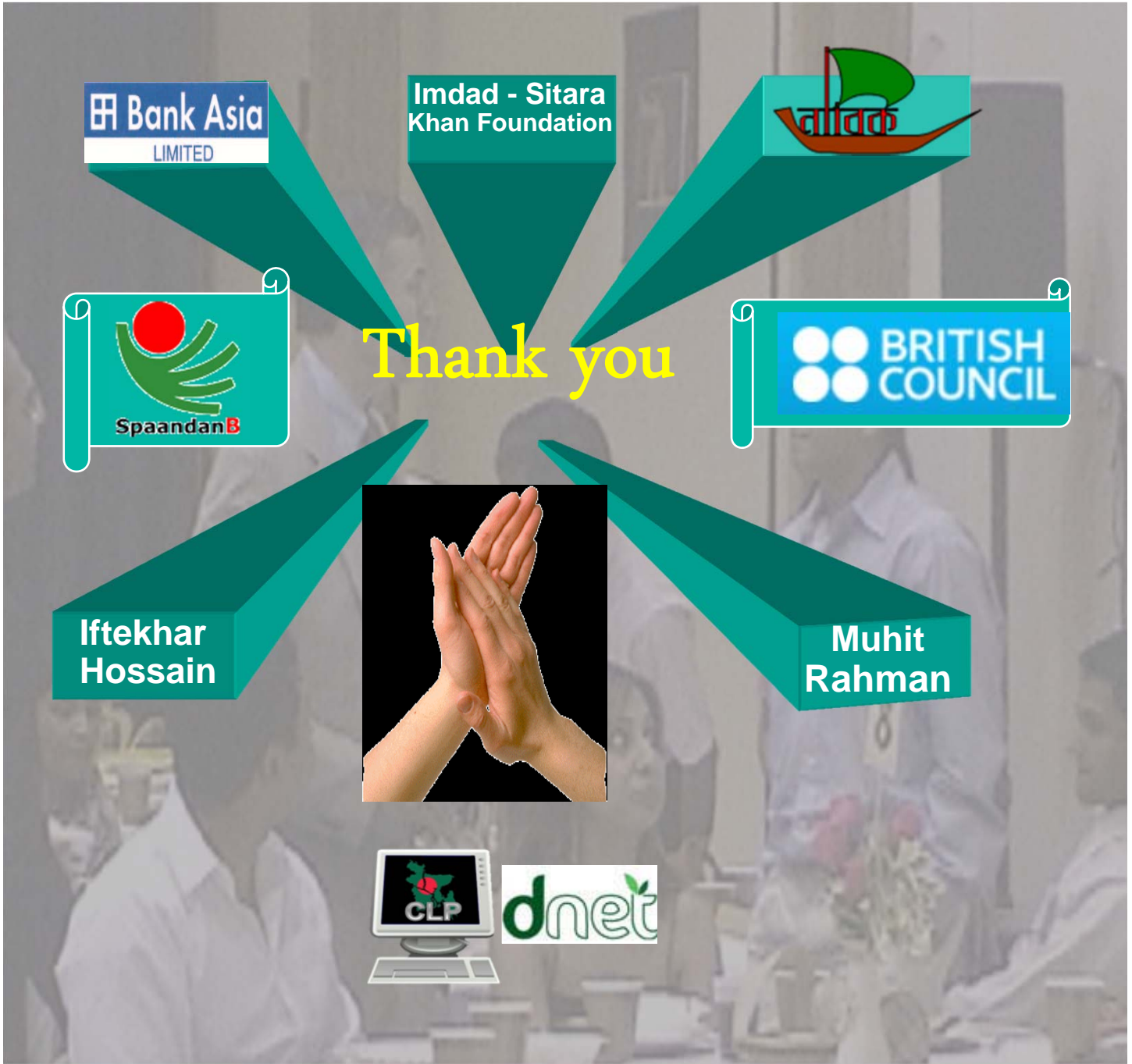
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## Reflections on Initiating Computer Literacy at Pirkhain

I am an expatriate Bangladeshi living abroad for many years. I visit Bangladesh from time to time and do some voluntary work to help improve the school education in the locality I come from. I believe that through education, training and learning new skills people of rural Bangladesh may have the opportunity to come out of the poverty that seem to cripple their lives. In my pursuit to make a small contribution to this end I came in contact with the New Jersey-based Computer Literacy Program Volunteers for the Underprivileged (CLP) who have similar motivation. Here is the story of my journey with those expatriate volunteers.

Pirkhain Mowlana Ashraf Chowdhury High School was founded in 2002 in Pirkhain, southern Chittagong. The adjoining photograph shows part of the tin-shed brick-wall school building. The school's first batch completed class X at the end of 2007 and appeared in the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examination in early 2008. Current enrollment of the school is over 800, and based on performance of the students in the SSC Examination, the school is considered a model that is trying to meet the educational needs of the community. The school infrastructure has grown since its inception. In addition to adding new class rooms, a Science Lab and a library were added. The need for computer education in the school became obvious and accordingly, more land was acquired and a building completed to accommodate the computer class and lab in 2009. All of the above were achieved with support from the community and expatriates in Canada and USA.



The next challenge was to secure necessary hardware and start a computer training program. Around that time period Bangladesh Government initiated a program to provide computers to educational institutions. The program logistics did not enable us to secure computers for a village school. There was no provision for teacher training. I observed computers given to many schools collecting dust waiting to be used. The reason was lack of knowledge and training of school staff on the use of these sophisticated machines. This experience alarmed us as we started thinking about acquiring computers for the school.

During my January 2009 visit to Bangladesh, I heard about a meeting organized by CLP and Dnet, its partner in Bangladesh. I attended the meeting and learned about their Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) and Smart Class Rooms (SCRs). Under a Private Public Partnership (PPP) Initiative of the Government of Bangladesh they began a project to set up a CLC and a SCR in any eligible high school. A CLC is a turn-key computer lab with four computers, a structured curriculum drawn by local experts, training for two teachers, training manual and full supervision to address operational issues. In a SCR students have the opportunity to learn from educational CDs that feature sight, sound, and animation with the contents being displayed on a large screen monitor. I was glad that I was in Dhaka at the time and was able to attend the meeting. What they presented were answers to my concerns about how to start an operational and effective computer training and computer-aided education program. I immediately signed up as a sponsor for a CLC and a SCR in Pirkhain School, and CLP helped establish both the CLC and the SCR in 2011 (shown in the picture on next page).

I found the CLP program so useful that I convinced some of my friends and relatives to sponsor the project in their schools and we were able to introduce CLCs and SCR in 7 more high schools in rural Chittagong. The salient feature of the program was that it was based on co-operation of multiple partners, such as, 1) a sponsor financing 30% of the cost, 2) Bangladesh Government through its PPP Initiative

providing rest of financing, 3) the host school providing computer classroom, furnishings, security and teachers; 4) Dnet setting up computers, printers and other peripherals, training the teachers, and providing other technical assistance (trouble shooting and solving computer-related problems). Training the selected teachers in the use of computers was a crucial part of the project, because that prepared them to teach the students.



Overall, I found the Computer Literacy Program to work out very well for most of the schools I was associated with. Our association with CLP-Dnet team came as a blessing solving most of our computer related problems. Even when the sponsors did not continue providing the annual maintenance fee, the program provided trouble shooting advice over phone which kept the centers operational.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank one and all involved with organizing and running the project for so many years with excellent outcome (a report on the performance of the CLC and SCR at the school is provided in the Appendix below). I think, any country like Bangladesh will benefit with more of this type of well-planned program. I think CLP should be considered a model for future development work, especially on the education and training side. I am, however, not sure if there has been any follow-up mechanism to determine the outcome of this project. I wish to congratulate all those who envisioned the program and worked to put into effect.

**Teacher's Comment on SCR**

“SCR model is very effective to conduct classroom teaching-learning activity through modern technology. Students get their motivation from technology driven classrooms and eagerly wait to see new videos, animations and Power Point slides. Learners can keep their concentration in class and understand the difficult lessons properly. From one of my experience I can say that it is much easier to show the functioning of human heart (A lesson of Class 8 Science book) through animation rather than described it verbally. As a result it helps them to learn from class room”.

**Teacher's Comment on CLC**

“CLC is very important for spreading digital literacy among rural underprivileged students who are not familiar with computer and digital equipment. CLC gives them a chance to obtain basic literacy on computer. I know two students who graduated from CLC and started their own business. One of them started a computer compose, printing and web browse based business in this locality. Another started mobile repairing business after getting motivation and confidence from this training. More specifically, some of our CLC graduates enrolled in polytechnic institutes, national and public universities.
