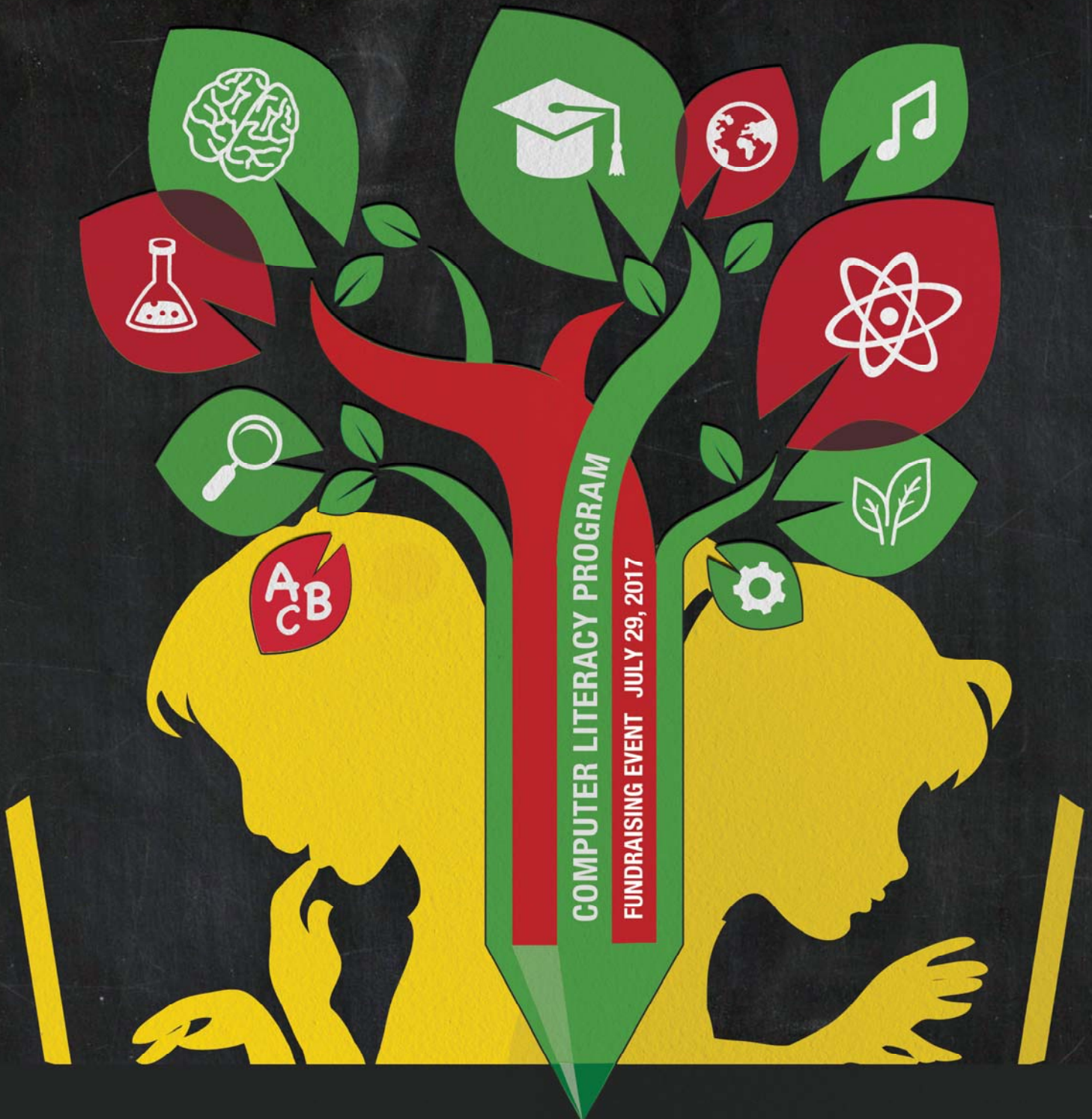

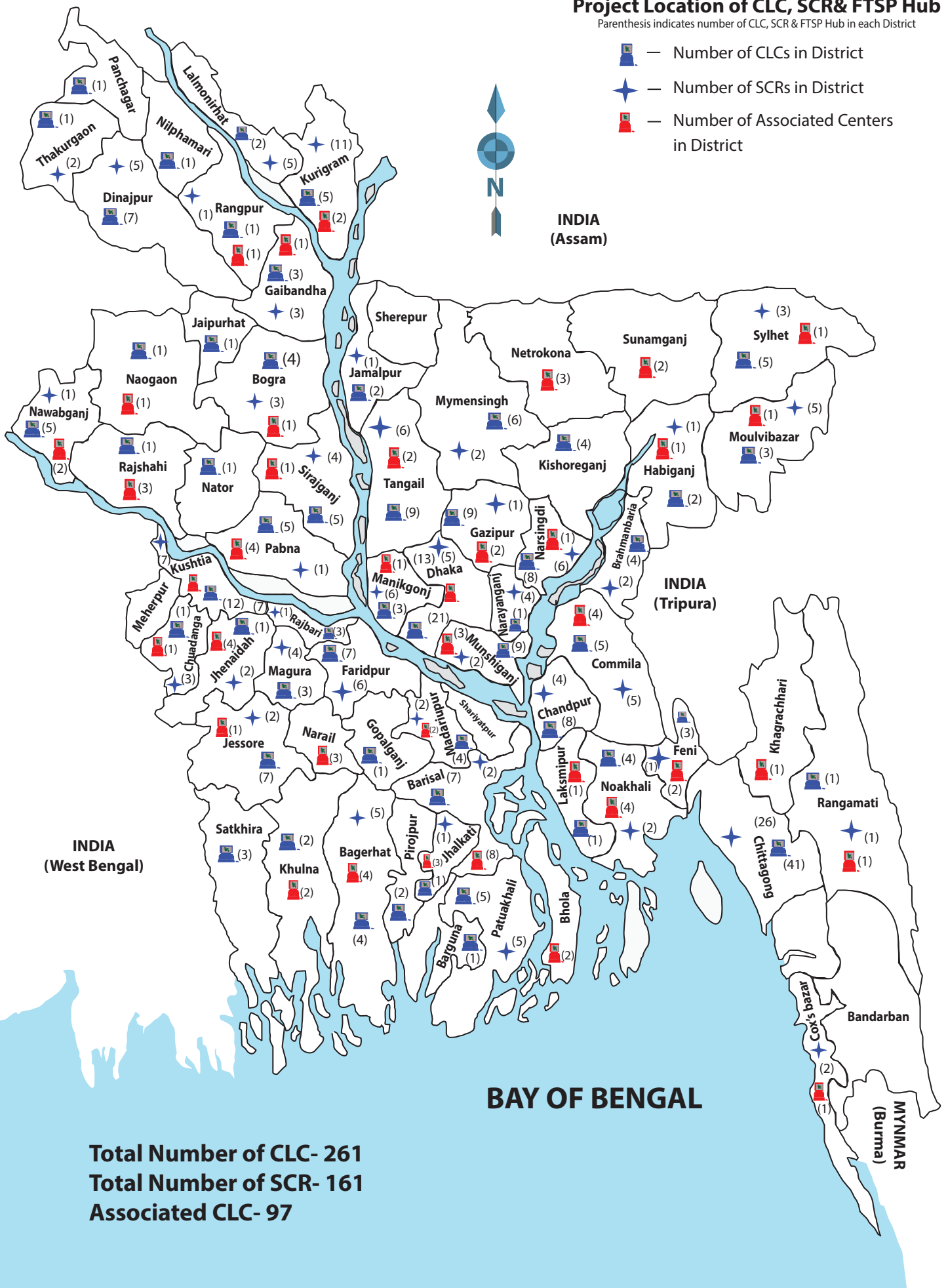

## *Computer Literacy Program for the Underprivileged (2004-2017)*

### *Progress through innovation*

*The Computer Literacy program (CLP) was launched thirteen years ago to help bridge the “digital divide” that exists between an underprivileged student in rural Bangladesh and a student from an affluent family in the nation’s capital, not to mention with a student from a developed country. Making computers and basic training in computer usage available were identified as the key first steps towards that end. The program certainly has come a long way with now 358<sup>[1]</sup> Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) in rural Bangladesh with over 100,000 computer literate graduates getting into institutions of higher education or work force.*

*While our primary focus has been computer literacy, we have continually looked for ways to enhance educational opportunities leveraging on the hardware/software and human resources we developed over the decade. As soon as Internet connection became available in any CLC locality, we provided that CLC access to*



*the Internet, thereby connecting the center to the wide world of digital information. Our realization that without a working knowledge of everyday English our students would be at a severe disadvantage in this age of globalization, made us launch the “Computer Teaches Everyday English” initiative in 2009. Our next innovation was the introduction of Smart Class Rooms (SCRs) aimed at making a transition from the traditional “learning-by-listening-to-lecture” mode to “learning-by-doing” and from multi-media presentations. Every SCR is equipped with a laptop*

*computer, a large screen monitor and other essential peripherals, engaging educational CDs on Mathematics, English, Science and Geography. These CDs are rich in color and animation, and so are additional contents derived from the Internet and other open sources. Supervised by especially trained teachers, SCRs are student favorites that are transforming the educational landscape in rural Bangladesh. The focus of the Education through Entertainment (EE) project that was initiated as a pilot project in 2016 is to instill values in students through entertaining and engaging activities. The students see educational videos, documentaries, or movies followed by lively participatory discussions on the subject pertaining to the presentation. The discussions are steered by a trained teacher so that students’ knowledge on the topic and verbal communication skills are sharpened. Connecting Students Around the World (CSAW) is another initiative whose seeds are just being sown. CSAW leverages the advances in communication technology (such as, Skype) to bring together students from different corners of the world to share their experiences and perspectives, as well as to work on joint projects. The objective is to foster mutual understanding and build relationship.*

*Bangladesh has made considerable strides in introducing information technology in administration, communication, education, financial sector and other spheres. Bill Gates (referring to banking by bKash) thinks “this Bangladeshi upstart could revolutionize banking for the poor” (Bloomberg Television).*

*We reiterate our message from earlier years, that we are torn between our aspirations for establishing new centers and the need to maintain the existing centers. Our appeal to all our donors and patrons is, “Please be generous to help us maintain the centers that you helped establish.” Bangladesh is making progress in entering the digital age. We like to dream of a digitally connected, productive and prosperous Bangladesh. **Come, dream with us.***

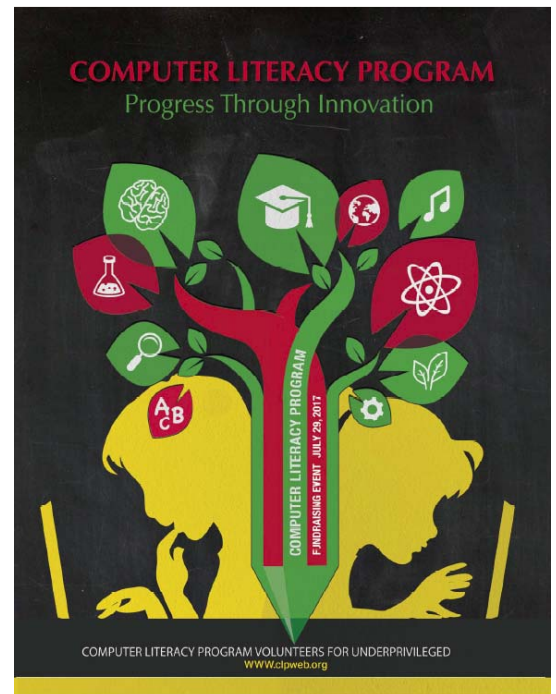

### **Dr. Nina Ahmad**

*Deputy Mayor for Public Engagement (Philadelphia, PA), and Trustee, Philadelphia Foundation, Philadelphia, PA*

*Dr. Ahmad is the Deputy Mayor for Public Engagement for the city of Philadelphia where she oversees the Mayor's commissions and offices on constituent-specific issues which include the Office of LGBT Affairs, the Office of Black Male Engagement and the Youth Commission. She is also the co-founder/ co-owner of JNA Capital, Inc., a real estate development and finance company based in Philadelphia, PA. Involvement in her local community is expansive; in 2011, she was appointed to the Philadelphia Community Foundation Board of Directors. Nina was a founding member of the Asian Mosaic Fund giving circle, and continues to serve on its advisory committee. Nina also sits on the Diversity Committee of William Penn Charter School (oldest Quaker School in the United States) and was one of the founding members of Asian Pacific Americans for Progress, a grassroots internet-empowered, national network of individuals who are committed to progressive action.*

*She serves on President Barack Obama's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders and as the President of the Philadelphia Chapter of the National Organization for Women (NOW). She also serves on the boards of the Pennsylvania Immigration and Citizenship Coalition (PICC) and Women's Campaign International, which focuses on women's equality through building skills to help women become effective agents of change.*

*Nina received her Doctoral degree in 1990 from Chemistry Department of the University of Pennsylvania. As a Postdoctoral Fellow, she trained with noted collagen expert, Darwin Prockop, M.D., Ph.D. at Thomas Jefferson University. Nina resides in the Mt. Airy neighborhood of Philadelphia with her husband Ahsan Nasratullah and two daughters.*



**David Purdy** joined New York University Stern School of Business as a Clinical Assistant Professor of Management Communication in 2012, after having been an adjunct lecturer since 2010. He teaches both MBA and undergraduate courses through Stern's Management Communication Department, as well as facilitating seminars through Stern's Executive Education program.

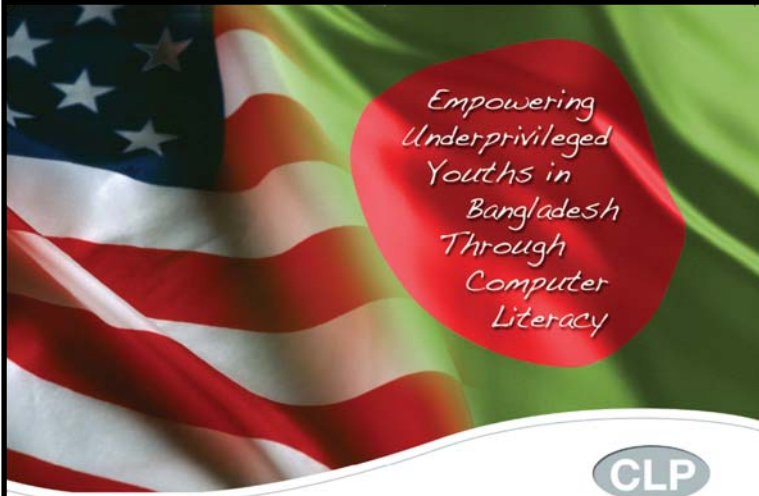

## ডিজিটাল পথচলা

[Since its inception in 2005, the Computer Literacy Program (CLP) has produced ~ 100,000 Computer Literacy graduates in rural Bangladesh. The basic training includes 40 hours of hands-on exercise in computer operation and use of several common software. Additional ~50,000 students received their practical training per the national ICT curriculum. How does this training influence the students? Does it have any effect on their career choices? What follow are stories of two young men who received their first exposure to computers at two of the 261 computer labs that the CLP established in Bangladesh.]

### নাসিম আল আওয়াল

২০০৩ সাল। তখন আমি ছাত্তারপাড়া উচ্চ বিদ্যালয়ের অষ্টম শ্রেণির ছাত্র। সাদা রঙের একটা টিভি যেটা কিনা ডানে-বামে খুব সহজেই ঘোরানো যায়, এবং উপর নিচেও করা যায়- এমন একটা যন্ত্রের সাথে আমার প্রথম দেখা। এর সাথে সাদা রঙের আরেকটা বক্স, বড় ক্যালকুলেটরের মতন অনেকগুলো বাটনওয়ালা একটা বোর্ড আর একটা চাকাওয়ালা রিমোট কন্ট্রোল। পরে জানলাম এগুলো আসলে কম্পিউটার নামক যন্ত্রের এক একটা অংশ- মনিটর, সিপিইউ, কী-বোর্ড আর মাউস। আর ঐ কম্পিউটারে সম্ভবত অপারেটিং সিস্টেম ছিল “মাইক্রোসফট উইন্ডোজ ৯৮”। আমার এক বন্ধু চিশতী, যাদের পরিবার থেকে এই কম্পিউটারটি বিদ্যালয়ে দেয়া হয়েছিল; ওদের বাড়িতেও কম্পিউটার ছিল। চিশতীই আমাকে প্রথম ওই কম্পিউটার ল্যাভে নিয়ে যায়। সিনেমায় প্রদর্শিত পরিচালক, নায়ক, নায়িকাদের নাম যেভাবে উড়ে উড়ে আসে, সেগুলো পাওয়ারপয়েন্টের স্লাইডের মাধ্যমে কিভাবে তৈরি করা হয় তা দেখালো। এরপর একটা গেইম দেখালো- হেলিকপ্টারে করে গুলি ছুড়ে শত্রুদের ঘায়েল করে মিত্রদের উদ্ধার করা। আমি খুব আগ্রহ নিয়ে দেখেছিলাম আর মনে হয়েছিল, আমার বন্ধু যদি পারে তাহলে আমি কেন পারবনা ?

এরপর ২০০৫ সাল। আমাকে আমার গ্রামের স্কুল থেকে আরো ভালো আমলা সদরপুর উচ্চ বিদ্যালয়ে ভর্তি করা হল। তখন আমি ক্লাস নাইনো জানতে পারলাম আমাদের স্কুলে কম্পিউটার এসেছে। শ্রদ্ধেয় ফরিদ উদ্দিন স্যার এবং ওবাইদুল্লা পিন্টু স্যার ঢাকা থেকে কয়েকটা কম্পিউটার নিয়ে এলেন। আমরা সবাই ভীষণ উৎসুক হয়ে গেলাম কম্পিউটার ল্যাভে। আমার বাড়ি থেকে আমাকে ৪র্থ বিষয় হিসেবে জীববিজ্ঞান নিয়ে পড়ার কথা বললেও আমি “কম্পিউটার শিক্ষা” বিষয়টি নিই শুধুমাত্র কম্পিউটার শেখার প্রবল আগ্রহ থেকে।

এপ্রিল ২০০৫-এ আমি আমাদের বিদ্যালয়ের “কম্পিউটার লিটারেসি সেন্টার”-এ ৩য় ব্যাচে ভর্তি হলাম। স্যারদের মুখে শুনেছিলাম যে, ডিনেট নামক ঢাকাস্থ একটি প্রতিষ্ঠান আর ভাব-নিউজার্সি নামক যুক্তরাষ্ট্রের একটি প্রতিষ্ঠান যৌথভাবে আমাদের স্কুলে চারটি কম্পিউটার প্রদানের মাধ্যমে আমাদের এই ডিজিটাল কার্যক্রমে অংশগ্রহণের সুযোগ করে দিয়েছে। আমাদের ল্যাভের বাইরেও বোর্ডে এই প্রতিষ্ঠান দুটির নাম দেখতে পাই। আমাদের শিক্ষকরা আমাদের অনেক যত্ন আর আগ্রহ নিয়ে ধরে ধরে শেখাতেন। প্রতিনিয়ত এই যন্ত্র দ্বারা নতুন নতুন চমক পাওয়ায় আমার ভেতরে একটা আলাদা স্পৃহা, আলাদা একধরনের স্বপ্ন জেগে ওঠে। এই যন্ত্র নিয়ে পড়াশোনা, এই যন্ত্রকে জানাশোনা, এই যন্ত্রকে নিয়ে ভাবতে ভালো লাগা শুরু করে। আমাদের ক্লাসের কম্পিউটার বইটিও আমি ভালোভাবে পড়া শুরু করে দেই এবং আমার ক্লাসের অন্যান্য বন্ধুদের চেয়ে এই বিষয়ে খুব দ্রুত এগিয়ে যাই। কম্পিউটার নিয়ে স্বপ্ন দেখার পথের শুভ সূচনা হয় এই সিএলসি ল্যাব থেকেই। আমি হৃদয়পুরে থাকতাম আর আমার স্কুল ছিল বাড়ি থেকে সাড়ে চার কিলোমিটার দূরে আমলাতো। স্কুল শুরু হবার এক ঘন্টা আগে আমাদের সিএলসি ক্লাস শুরু হতো। প্রায় সাড়ে চার কিলোমিটার রাস্তা কখনও সাইকেলে, কখনও বা হেঁটে আসতে হতো। একটা রাস্তা ছিল মাঠের ভেতর দিয়ে, দুর্গম আর নির্জন, যেটাতে সময় লাগতো মাত্র ৩০ মিনিট। সপ্তাহে তিনদিন করে ক্লাস হতো আমাদের। আমি ঐ তিনদিন আসতাম ঐ সংক্ষিপ্ত পথ দিয়ে। বৈশাখ-জ্যৈষ্ঠ মাস হওয়াতে ঐসময়ে রোদ, ঝড়, বৃষ্টি লেগেই থাকত। আমি ঐ দুর্খোগের ভেতরেও সবকিছুকে উপেক্ষা করে ঠিক সময় মতন চলে আসতাম। রোদে পুড়ে আর বৃষ্টিতে ভিজে যখন ক্লাসে এসে ঢুকতাম, তখন কম্পিউটারের এই চমকগুলো মুহূর্তের মধ্যে সকল কষ্ট ভুলিয়ে দিত। আমার বাড়ি থেকেও সবসময়ের জন্য বলত যে, কম্পিউটার শেখো। কম্পিউটার শিখতে পারলে অনেক বড় ইঞ্জিনিয়ার হওয়া যাবে। কম্পিউটার ছাড়া সামনের দিনগুলোতে অসুবিধায় পড়তে হবে। পাড়ার কিছু মানুষ অবশ্য বলত যে, কম্পিউটার শিখতে অনেক খরচ লাগে আর আমার পরিবার তো এই মেশিন আমাকে কিনে দিতে পারবে না, তাই শুধু শুধু এটা শেখার চেয়ে না শেখাই ভালো। আমি তাদের কথায় কান দিতাম না। প্রযুক্তি আমার বরাবরই ভালো লাগতো, তখনও আর এখনও।

আমাদের ব্যাচের মধ্যে আমি সবার চেয়ে এগিয়ে ছিলাম এবং এটা নিয়ে আমার বন্ধু মহলের কাছ থেকেও একটা অন্য রকম সমাদর পেতাম। স্কুলে থাকতে আমি কম্পিউটারে এ প্লাস পেয়েছিলাম শুধু মাত্র এই কম্পিউটারের প্রতি অত্যধিক আগ্রহের জন্য। হাইস্কুল পেরিয়ে কলেজে এসেও আমি কম্পিউটার নিয়ে পড়াশোনা করি। আমার ক্লাসের ৪০ জনের মধ্যে কেবল মাত্র আমারই প্রথম পছন্দ ছিল “কম্পিউটার টেকনোলজি”। এখানেও আমি বেশ ভালো করি। কম্পিউটার শেখার পাশাপাশি ইন্টারনেটে শেখার জন্য আমার বাড়ী থেকে আমাকে কয়েকটা ছাগল বিক্রি করে আর ব্যাংক ঋণের মাধ্যমে কিছু টাকা দিয়ে একটা মোবাইল কিনে দেয়া। এই মোবাইলকে মডেম হিসেবে ব্যবহার করে আমি ইন্টারনেট শিখি। এখন অবশ্য অধিকাংশ কম্পিউটার লিটারেসি সেন্টারে ইন্টারনেট সংযোগ দেয়া হয়েছে। আমার মনে আছে, আমি আমার সকল বন্ধুদের ইমেইল আর ফেইসবুক একাউন্ট খুলে দিয়েছিলাম। আমি প্রতিনিয়তই ওদেরকে নতুন নতুন বিষয় দেখিয়ে চমকে দিতাম। “কম্পিউটার জিনিয়াস” বলে স্যাররা আমার প্রশংসা করতেন। আর আমার বন্ধুরা মজা করে আমাকে “ভাইরাস” বলতো। আমাকে ওরা জিজ্ঞাসা করতো যে আমি কোথায় কম্পিউটার চালানো শিখেছি। আমি ওদেরকে গর্ব করে বলতাম যে, ভাব-এনজে আর ডিনেটের দেয়া কম্পিউটার থেকে আমার হাতেখড়ি হয়।

২০১০ সালের শেষের দিকে আমি ডিপ্লোমার শেষ বর্ষের ছাত্র। তখন আমার সুযোগ হয় ডিনেটের সাথে কাজ করার- যে প্রতিষ্ঠানটির সৌজন্যে আমার বিদ্যালয়ে আমি প্রথম কম্পিউটার শিখেছি; যা ছিল আমার কাছে স্বপ্ন পূরণের মতো। এখানে আমার পূর্ব অভিজ্ঞতা কাজে লাগিয়ে বেশ ভালোভাবেই তিন মাসব্যাপী ইন্ট্রানশীপ শেষ করি। ডিপ্লোমা শেষ করে আমার কর্মজীবন শুরু হয় ডিনেটের সিএলপি প্রোগ্রামের সাথে অর্থাৎ সেই প্রোগ্রামটি যার মাধ্যমে আমার বিদ্যালয়ে কম্পিউটার দেওয়া হয়েছিল। এখানে আমি টেকনিক্যাল টিমে কম্পিউটার হার্ডওয়্যার ও সফটওয়্যার সম্পর্কিত কাজ করি। ক্লাস নাইনে যে শিক্ষা পেয়েছিলাম তা এখানেও কাজে লাগে দারুণভাবে।

আমার পড়ালেখা চলাকালীন সময় থেকে শুরু করে এ পর্যন্ত আমার অনেক সুযোগ হয়েছে গ্রামের শিক্ষার্থীদের সান্নিধ্যে আসার। তাদের আমি সবসময়ই কম্পিউটার শিক্ষা গ্রহণের জন্য উৎসাহিত করেছি। এখনও আমাদের গ্রামাঞ্চলে অনেক জায়গা আছে যেখানে কম্পিউটার পৌঁছায়নি। সেইসব গ্রামের শিক্ষার্থীরা পিছিয়ে আছে। ডিজিটাল শিক্ষা গ্রহণে। বাংলাদেশ সরকার এই দূরত্ব কমানোর জন্য প্রায় সবগুলো শিক্ষা প্রতিষ্ঠানেই একটি করে ল্যাপটপ এবং মাল্টিমিডিয়া প্রজেক্টর দিয়েছে। যদিও সেগুলো পর্যাপ্ত নয় তবুও কিছুটা হলেও শিক্ষার্থীরা এগিয়ে যাচ্ছে। ল্যাপটপের দাম কমলেও তা সবার আর্থিক সামর্থ্যের মধ্যে নয়। যেকারণে সরকারের পাশাপাশি বাংলার গ্রামাঞ্চলে যদি এমন উদ্যোগ নেওয়া হয় তবে তা আরো অনেক শিক্ষার্থীর স্বপ্নপূরণে সহায়ক হবে। ডিনেটে সুদীর্ঘ পাঁচ বছর ধরে এই সিএলপি প্রোগ্রামের সাথে কাজ করতে গিয়ে আমি বাংলাদেশের ৫৪টি জেলাতে প্রায় ২৫০ টির বেশী স্কুল পরিদর্শনের সুযোগ পেয়েছি। আমার মনে হয়েছে বিদ্যালয়ের শিক্ষকদের সাথে যোগাযোগ বাড়িয়ে নিয়মিত খোঁজখবর নেয়া- এ কার্যক্রমের পরিবর্তনে সহায়ক হবে। এছাড়া শিক্ষকদের সম্মানীর অংকটা বাড়াতে পারলে, তাঁরা আরো বেশী সময় ও মনোযোগ দিতে পারবেন। আমি মনে করি বর্তমান সরকার যে ডিজিটাল বাংলাদেশ গড়ার স্বপ্ন দেখছেন, সেই স্বপ্ন বাস্তবায়নের ক্ষেত্রে এই প্রোগ্রাম ব্যাপক ভাবে সহায়ক। সরকারের পাশাপাশি যে সকল ব্যক্তি বা প্রতিষ্ঠান এরকম মহৎ উদ্যোগ গ্রহণের মাধ্যমে দেশকে এগিয়ে নেওয়ার পেছনে ভূমিকা রাখছে, তাদের সহায়তার মাত্রা আরো বাড়ালে বাংলাদেশ দ্রুত পৌঁছতে পারবে তার কাঙ্ক্ষিত লক্ষ্যে।



## শুভ মণ্ডল

আমি কদমবাড়ী উচ্চবিদ্যালয়ে ২০০৫ সালে ৬ষ্ঠ শ্রেণিতে ভর্তি হই। পঞ্চম শ্রেণির বৃত্তি পরীক্ষার সংবর্ধনা অনুষ্ঠানে গিয়ে আমি প্রথম কম্পিউটার দেখি। দেখেছিলাম টেলিভিশনের মত একটা পর্দা আর তার মধ্যে তীর চিহ্নযুক্ত কারসরটা মনে হচ্ছিল। এমনি এমনি একজায়গা থেকে অন্য জায়গায় চলে যাচ্ছে। আর তার মধ্যে লেখা দেখা যাচ্ছিল। স্কুলে ফিরে এসে দেখতে পেলাম স্কুলে সেই টেলিভিশন আর মাইক সেটের মত জিনিসটা যে ঘরে রাখা আছে তার বাইরে উপরে লেখা কম্পিউটার কক্ষ। তখন আমি বুঝলাম এটার নাম কম্পিউটার। আমার কম্পিউটারে হাতে খড়ি হয় ২০০৫ সালের ডিসেম্বর মাসে শিক্তা রাণী অধিকারী ম্যাডাম ও মনোজ কুমার বিশ্বাস স্যারের হাতে। কম্পিউটার লিটারেসি প্রোগ্রামের উদ্যোগে কদমবাড়ী উচ্চ বিদ্যালয়ে একটি Computer Literacy Center (CLC) স্থাপন করা হয়। উদ্দেশ্য ছাত্রছাত্রীদের বিনামূল্যে কম্পিউটার শেখানো। বার্ষিক পরীক্ষার শেষ দিন আমাকে শিক্তা ম্যাডাম বললেন “শুভ তোমাদের মধ্য থেকে ১২ জনের নামের একটা তালিকা দাও, তোমাদের

কম্পিউটার শেখানো হবে” আমি ছিলাম ক্লাশের ক্যাপটেন, তাই দায়িত্বটা আমরা প্রথম দিন কম্পিউটার রুমে গিয়ে দেখতে পেলাম কম্পিউটারের সাথে আরো অনেক কিছু আছে সেখানে মনোজ স্যার আমাদের প্রথম কম্পিউটার চালনা শেখান। স্যার আমাদের “এসো কম্পিউটার শিখি”- বইটি দেখালেন।

বইটি ব্যবহার করে শিক্ষার্থীরা কি শিখবে তার একটা বর্ণনা ছিল। তার মধ্যে “আগ্রহী শিক্ষার্থীরা কম্পিউটার এবং তথ্য প্রযুক্তির বিশাল জ্ঞান জগতে প্রবেশের উপযোগী হয়ে উঠবে”- কথাটি আমাকে খুব আকর্ষণ করে। আমি খুব মনোযোগ দিয়ে শেখার চেষ্টা করি।

আমার বেশী ভালো লাগত কোন সমস্যা হলে তার সমাধান করা। আমি ট্রাবলশুটিং নির্দেশ বুঝে বুঝে পড়ে সমাধান করার চেষ্টা করতাম। আর যখনই সমস্যা সমাধান হয়ে যেত আমার শেখার আগ্রহ আরো বেড়ে যেত। একবার স্টাট বার উল্টে গিয়ে বেশ ঝামেলায় পড়ে গেল আমার এক বন্ধু। আমি সে সমস্যাটা সমাধান করতে পারায় সবাই খুব খুশি।

দেখতে দেখতে আমাদের নির্ধারিত সময় ৩২ ঘণ্টার কোর্স শেষ হয়ে গেল। আমাদের গ্রুপের মধ্যে আমি বেশ ভালো পারায় শিক্তা ম্যাডাম বললেন, তুমি আমাদের সাথে কাজ করবে প্রতিদিন বিকেলে স্কুল ছুটির পর। তার পর থেকে আমি স্যারদের সাথে অন্যদের কম্পিউটার শিখাতাম এবং সেই সাথে আমার মনে যত প্রশ্ন ছিল তার উত্তর খোঁজার চেষ্টা করতাম। আমি স্কুলে ছুটির পর প্রতিদিন অন্যদের কম্পিউটার শিখাতাম। আমার একটা ডাক নাম তৈরি হয়ে গেল ‘কম্পিউটার ম্যান’।

যখন কোন কম্পিউটারে সমস্যা হতো তখন আমি সেটা সমাধান করার চেষ্টা করতাম। সমাধান করতে না পারলে আমি নিজেই ডিনেটের সাথে যোগাযোগ করতাম। সেই সূত্রে আমার পরিচয় হয় অজয় দাদা আর হান্নান ভাইয়ের সাথে।

একদিন হান্নান ভাই এসেছিলেন কম্পিউটার মেরামতের কাজ করতে। আমি সারাদিন তার সাথে ছিলাম আর দেখছিলাম কিভাবে সারানোর কাজ করা হয়। সেদিন কাজ করতে করতে রাত হয়ে গিয়েছিল।

অজয়দার সাথে কথা বলে আমি অনুপ্রেরণা পেতাম। আমি সহকারী ট্রেইনার হিসেবে ৪ বছর পর্যন্ত স্যারদের সাথে আমার স্কুলে কাজ করি। সেই অভিজ্ঞতা থেকে ২০১০ সালে একটি বই লিখি, “কম্পিউটার অপারেটর’স মিনি গাইড” আমার বিদ্যালয় থেকে কম্পিউটার শিক্ষা গ্রহণ করে আমার কম্পিউটার শেখার আগ্রহ আরো বেড়ে যায়। ২০১০ সালে এস.এস.সি পাশ করে আমি একাদশ শ্রেণিতে কদমবাড়ী ইউনিয়ন মহাবিদ্যালয়ে ভর্তি হই। সেখানে তখন কোন CLC ছিল না। যাঁর সৌজন্যে কদমবাড়ী স্কুলে CLC খোলা হয়েছিল, আমি যুক্তরাষ্ট্র প্রবাসী সে স্পন্সরের সাথে যোগাযোগ করে কদমবাড়ী কলেজে একটি CLC খোলার জন্য অনুরোধ করি। এভাবে তাঁর অনুদানে ডিনেট আমাদের কলেজে একটি CLC স্থাপন করে। সেখানেও আমি আবার কম্পিউটার শেখার সুযোগ পাই। ২০১২ সালে আমি এইচ.এস.সি পাশ করি।

আমি গোপালগঞ্জ গভ: বঙ্গবন্ধু কলেজ বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ে পদার্থ বিজ্ঞান বিষয়ে ২০১৩ সালে ভর্তি হই। কিন্তু আমার মন পড়ে থাকত কম্পিউটারে। তাই আমি এখন কম্পিউটার সাইন্স এন্ড ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং পড়ছি। বাংলাদেশের সমস্ত স্কুল কলেজে Computer Literacy Center থাকা অত্যন্ত জরুরী বলে আমি মনে করি। ডিজিটাল বাংলাদেশ গড়ার প্রত্যয়ে ডিনেটের কার্যক্রম অব্যাহত থাকলে প্রত্যেক ছাত্র ছাত্রী প্রাথমিক ভাবে কম্পিউটার শেখার সুযোগ পাবে। তথ্য প্রযুক্তির এই যুগে কম্পিউটার বিষয়ে জ্ঞান থাকা আশু প্রয়োজন। CLP ও ডিনেট আমার জীবনে এক নতুন দ্বার খুলে দিয়েছে। ধন্যবাদ CLP! ধন্যবাদ ডিনেট!





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## CLP Initiates a New Program in 2017: Connecting Students around the World (CSAW)

CLP's latest project is Connecting Students around the World (CSAW) that brings together students from two different schools in two different countries through joint projects and live video discussion. This project aims at fostering cultural communication, friendship, and what is even more important, developing understanding between youths living in different corners of the world. Another objective is to improve communication skills particularly English communication skills of students from countries where English is not the native language.

This unique project was developed in collaboration with Ms. Jill Stedronsky, a English teach William Annin Middle School (WAMS) in Baskin Ridge, NJ, USA. The first pilot was ru WAMS and Uddipon Bader –Shamsu Bidya Niketon (UBSBN), a school in rural Chitali of B district in Bangladesh, on April 17, 2017 with great success. In late March 2017, the UBSBN s prepared a video that showed their homes, daily life, school, and the village market. The (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8DzaUTpmTZk>) really impressed the 8th Grade stud WAMS. They in turn also prepared and shared a video depicting their school, activities, super library and other aspects of life in an affluent small town. The video is:<https://youtu.be/D2T9WI>

Next the students from both schools emailed each other a set of questions. On April 17 they held a live Skype video conference to answer each other's questions. Given the 10 hour time difference, the kids at WAMS came to school by 6.40 AM, which is one hour before their normal arrival time. Eight thousand miles away in Chitali though the school day ended at 4 pm, the students of the English Club stayed an hour extra for the Skype session to begin at 5 PM Bangladesh local time (7 AM, New Jersey local time). It was heart-warming to observe how kids from such diverse socio-economic, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds could connect so well, so quickly.

This pilot project has noticeably shown how self-confidence, understanding and friendship between students living at two different corners of the world and coming from diverse socio-economic background could be nurtured through a simple live collaboration project described here.

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## Education through Entertainment

Education through Entertainment (EE) is a new initiative of the Computer Literacy Program that leverages the computer and multimedia facilities at the Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) and/or Smart Class Rooms (SCRs) to provide students with an entertaining platform for acquiring knowledge. The objectives of the program are to instill knowledge and values, such as tolerance, global awareness, environmental conscientiousness, entrepreneurship in students, as well as to sharpen their communication skills students through entertaining co-curricular activities.

Launched in 2016, the initiative was run as a pilot project in five schools with SCRs. While we expect the scope and format of EE to evolve, in the current form it involves use of engaging video(s) to draw students' attention to interesting and important topics. The topics intended to be covered and eventually collected in the EE content library may belong to diverse areas, such as, general knowledge, science, literature, arts, nature, history, geography, environment, personalities, current issues and events, health, medicine, entrepreneurship to name a few.

The first step in the EE project involves selection of *contents* in the above-mentioned areas. The videos pertaining to different contents are currently adapted from those available in the open sources, such as, existing videos, You Tube, Internet, websites, etc. In the pilot phase of the project, following 14 videos were assembled: *Visit Beautiful Places in Bangladesh, Language Movement, Life Story of Bill Gates, Balanced Diet, We'll Protect Ourselves, Be Kind, How to Succeed, Environmental Conservation, Apocalyptic Natural Disaster, Facts About Elephant, Global Fresh Water Challenge, Do What You are Good at, Build Good Habits, and Gain Wisdom from Stories*. These video pieces, adapted from different open sources have been organized in a CD (see Appendix I). The topics and videos received enthusiastic acceptance from students and teachers during the pilot project. Since then, the following 12 pieces have been added to the EE repertoire: *Rules and Manners, Unity, Physical Exercise, Wasfia's Journey, Our Universe, Tornado, Thunderstorm and Hail, Flood Safety, Earthquake Safety, Entrepreneurship, Cleanliness, Active Listening, and Climate Change*. Appendix 2 provides a complete list of contents developed to date.

Even a casual look at the above list of contents will reveal the intent of the EE initiative. The piece entitled *Language Movements* provides a glimpse of the pivotal event in our history; *Balanced Diet* is a lesson in food for good health; *Global Fresh Water Challenge* draws attention to the importance of water in sustaining life and need for preserving this precious resource; *Build Good Habits, Be Kind, and Gain Wisdom from Stories* are geared towards self-improvement and developing moral values; *Life Story of Bill Gates* is an inspirational story of what an entrepreneurial individual can accomplish from humble beginning, and so on.

The next important *step* is presenting the above-mentioned *contents* to students. Here a student-club model, such as, that of a debating society, or a science club has been adopted. The EE project activity is organized in structured *sessions*. An EE session covers two regular class periods (approximately 90 minutes). Typically, a session is run on a Thursday after the regular classes are over. In a typical session one (or depending on the length, two) videos are shown to students. Each video is accompanied by a lesson plan to guide the teacher on how to conduct the session and steer students' activities and discussions. After playing the video(s), the teacher opens the floor for discussion on the topic(s) covered by the video presentation. The optimization of students' participation in the discussion, so that everyone (as opposed to enthusiastic few) gets involved is emphasized, and the Lesson Plan provides specific suggestions to that end. The discussions among the students are steered so that they understand the intended teachings and develop action plans to translate their learning into practice as appropriate. Students from classes VI through X are expected to benefit from the EE Sessions.

The anticipated benefits of this program include: (a) Providing an engaging and enjoyable learning environment; (b) fostering listening and comprehension skills; (c) imparting knowledge, building moral

values and awareness through entertainment; and (d) sharpening communication skills through participatory discussions.

The EE project is still in its early stages of development. Immediate next steps include: (a) Improvement of initial 14 sessions with feedback from the pilot trials; (b) Developing a second CD to include the other 12 sessions with corresponding lesson plans (and/or, develop of a composite CD that includes all 26 videos and sessions); (c) Implement the project in other schools with CLC and/or SCR, which includes training teachers, providing the CD with lesson plan, and monitoring progress; and (d) Preparation of a field trial evaluation report.

We are optimistic about the value and impact of the EE project. This optimism derives from the reception that the EE Pilot phase has received, and potential “spin-offs” that may culminate from it. A particularly important spin-off of an EE session on Respect Diversity is developing into another new initiative, *Connect Students Around the World* (C-SAW, which is further detailed in the relevant article on page 15).

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## A Smart Class Room in Action

Just 40 Km (~25 miles) from Dhaka, we have one of our earliest CLCs and SCR in Shologhar AKSK High School in Sreenagar Upazilla. We wanted to pay an impromptu visit to a Smart Class Room at this school.

As prearranged, Mr. Kamrujjaman, Dnet's Project Director for Computer Literacy Program picked us (my sister and me) up at 7:45 AM sharp on February 18. It was a Saturday. Traffic was not as



maddening as it usually is. Driver navigated through winding roads of Old Dhaka. Across Buriganga, the traffic was slightly better. We reached the school within an hour and a half. It so happened that at that time it was a shift for girls and so as we walked through the entrance and the main playground surrounded by the school building, we saw mostly girls in their uniform, happy and playful. We were greeted by the head master, a gentleman in his early

forties-- well dressed in his tie and jacket. We were ushered into the headmaster's office where we met several other teachers including the math and computer teachers. The headmaster appraised us of the size of his student population of Shologhar AKSK High School established in 1925 and situated in Sreenagar Upazilla under Munshiganj district. The school has a big playground and a big pond and surrounded by natural beauty. Currently 1487 students are enrolling from grade VI to X, among them 845 are girls and 642 are boys. Students are mostly from middle class and lower middle class families.



The *Computer Literacy Center (CLC)* was established in this school back in 2005 by the generous support of Imdad-Sitara Khan Foundation, Saratoga, CA. Two computer teachers were trained for teaching the Basic Computer Course to students. To date 1879 students have received 40 hours computer course. Thanks to Bangladesh's attention to gender equity, 50% were girls. The *Smart Classroom (SCR)* established in June 2012 under Public Private Partnership (PPP) program with ICT Division of Bangladesh Government (Imdad Sitara Khan

Foundation was the private sponsor of the SCR). Four subject-based teachers received training under this project and they employed digital contents that had been developed for this project only. Our Bangladesh partner Dnet implemented the project.



The headmaster oriented us about school, CLC and SCR programs while I found him highly motivated towards our programs.

We were then escorted to the CLC and found 8 girls busy with 4 computers. Some students were engaged in painting and others were working on MS Word. I made a short conversation with them and found that they were very engrossed and excited to work with computers. The dedicated computer teacher informed us that he operates the center every day after schools hours. He also mentioned that they got technical support from Dnet regularly and they received two new computers this year.

Next, we were taken to the SCR. The teacher and the headmaster informed us about minor disruptions because of the ongoing renovation/painting. The repair work did not stop the operation of the SCR. Today's subject was health and its dependence on various food groups. The teacher went through a PowerPoint presentation on the subject and we observed them from behind. At the conclusion of the presentation the teacher divided the students into four groups to collect their thoughts and gave them 15 minutes before a presentation. Leaders from the four groups made presentation describing what they had learned. Clearly, girls did better than the boys, both in comprehension and in presentation. We tried to remember our school days and remembered with embarrassment how nervous we were if asked to make a presentation in front of a crowd. These kids are way ahead.

We returned happy after seeing an SCR in operation first hand. On our way back we took a detour to get some glimpses of the mega Padma bridge project.
