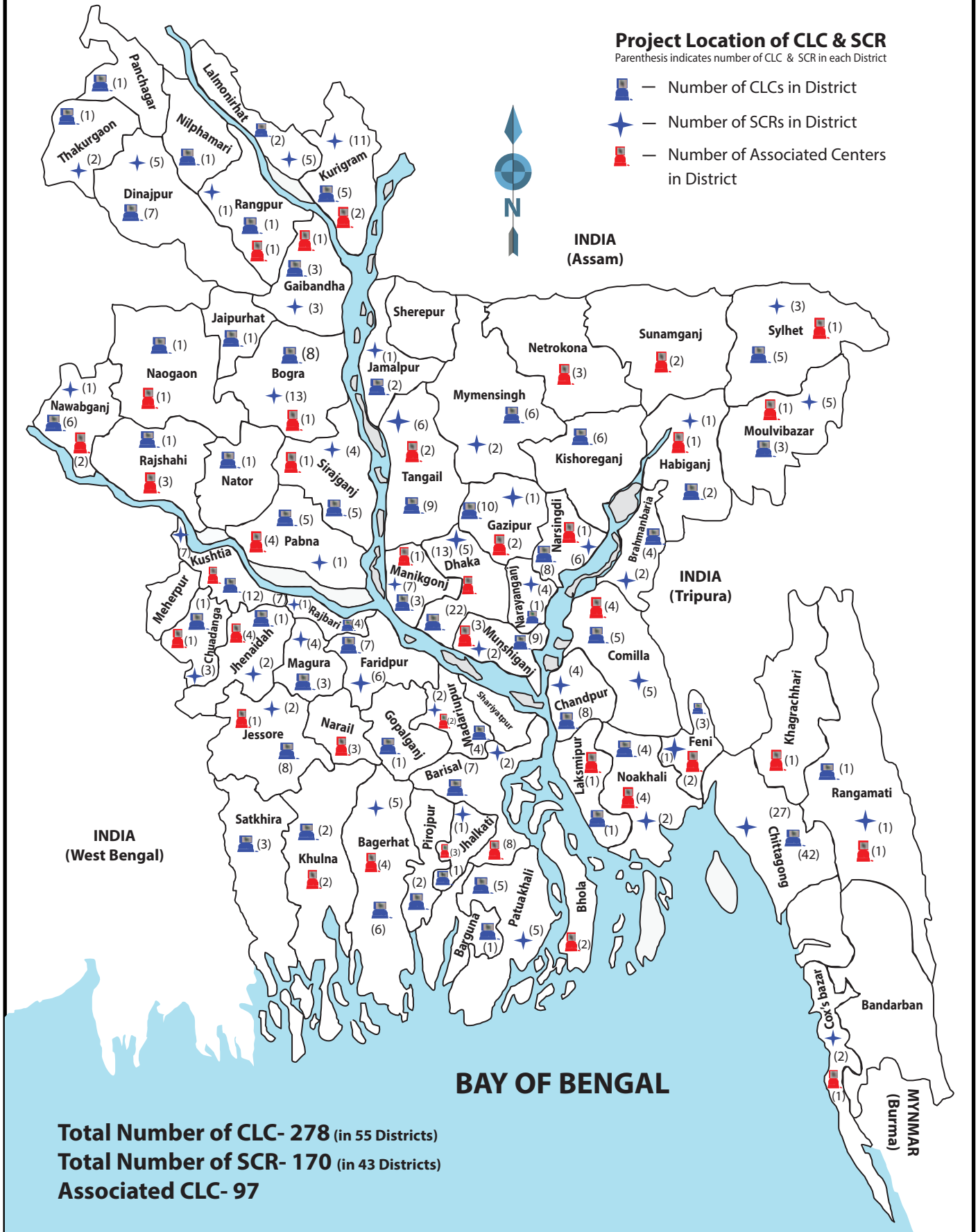

Computer Literacy Program for the Underprivileged (2004 -2020)

Striving amidst adversity



The sixteenth year of CLP started on an enthusiastic note. Following the successful launching of two super centers [Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) with more than ten computers] in the previous year, three more super centers were to be established in schools in Sherpur, Bogura. The Connect Students Around the World (CSAW) program was to be extended pairing a school in Ghorasal, Bangladesh with one in Hopewell, New Jersey, USA. Distant Instruction generated avid interest among school administrations, sponsors and volunteers willing to teach. What is even more inspiring, DUDOK, the Anti-Corruption Commission of Bangladesh signed a memorandum of understanding to initiate a moral value Education through Entertainment pilot project, which would subsequently be rolled out to 2000 schools. Work on all fronts started well.

Then COVID-19 struck. The pandemic debilitated the normal life and activities of people around the world. Bangladesh was no exception. Schools were closed down. It was no longer possible to conduct the regular CLP activities such as visiting schools for monitoring purpose, establishing new centers that require physical presence at the schools, holding computer training sessions at CLCs, and so on. CLP Annual Event for 2020 scheduled for July was postponed.

“When the going gets tough, the tough get going.” After the initial turmoil, the long-distance instruction for gifted and talented students in the CLP-affiliated school Uddipan Badar-Shamsu Bidyaniketan at Chitali, Bagerhat resumed. Dnet, the implementation partner of CLP in Bangladesh, got involved in Bangladesh Government’s initiative to design new education approaches for addressing the COVID-19 challenges. Dnet next started online meetings with CLP-affiliated schools for discussing and developing approaches to continue CLP activities during COVID-19 and beyond. Some of the schools requested Dnet to organize online training for their capacity building so that they can conduct online classes. Twenty-five teachers from five institutions where eleven new CLCs and SCRs are to be established are now receiving training on computer fundamentals, digital pedagogy, conducting Smart Class Room (SCR) sessions effectively, developing own contents for SCRs, and how to train students on basic computer operation and use of key Microsoft office software. The next task is conducting a refreshers’ training for the project teachers of CLP’s 79 supported schools. All the aforementioned training segments will be included in the refreshers’ training.

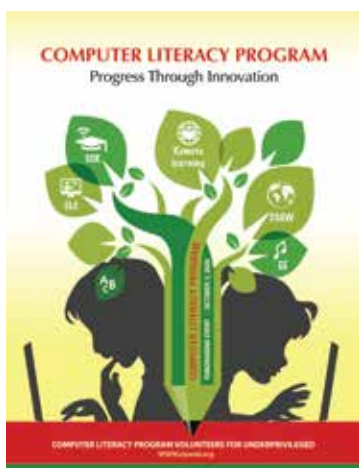
As the country is opening up, we will pursue our center establishment, hardware replacement and technical support activities, so that the teachers can use computers for preparing digital contents. Some of the hardware were acquired before the pandemic and would be sent out to schools as soon as the situation permits. DNet is also planning to introduce the so-called “Tele-education” aimed at providing instruction over mobile phone by volunteer teachers, each of them being responsible for a group of students. Finally, CLP is moving ahead with a definite plan to hold its 2020 Annual Event virtually on October 3, 2020 with participants and audience drawn from the US, Bangladesh, and other parts of the world.

While these efforts are no substitutes for regular face-to-face interactions, until normal conditions return or “new normal” is settled on, they keep the little lamps of learning, however flickering, lighted.

We thank you, our valued donors and sponsors, for supporting us throughout our journey, so far. **We seek your continued generosity to help us maintain the CLCs and SCRs that you helped establish.** We like to dream of a digitally connected, productive and prosperous Bangladesh. Come, dream with us.

From virtual to real, through computers to prosperity, we will empower the underprivileged youths of Bangladesh to enter the realm of hope by crossing the digital divide

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Tonight's distinguished speakers



Dr. Muhammed Zafar Iqbal obtained his Bachelors in Physics, Masters in Theoretical Physics from Dhaka University and Ph. D in Experimental Physics from University of Washington, Seattle. He did his post-doctoral work at Caltech and worked as a research scientist at Bell Communications Research, New Jersey, USA. He returned to Bangladesh in 1994 and joined Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (SUST), Sylhet as a Professor of the Department of Computer Science and Engineering. He retired from the university in 2019 after working for almost 25 years.

Dr. Iqbal was a pioneer in the development of Bangla computerization in the country. He set up a local area network with fiber optic backbone at SUST, the first of its kind in a public university in Bangladesh. He was instrumental in providing computer education and the Internet to the students and teachers of this university. In nineties he introduced mandatory computer courses for every student of SUST. In the year 2009 he introduced registration of university admission using cell telephone for the first time in Bangladesh which opened a new horizon in digital activities of Bangladesh. He and his team were awarded various national and international awards for this remarkable achievement. He also lead the team to develop “Pipilika” the first Bangla Search engine. He was awarded HEQEP (Higher Education Quality Enhancement Project) twice, once for Total Computerization of SUST, which made SUST the most ITC enabled university of the country. Right now he is leading the second HEQEP project for Industry-University collaboration on Bangla computerization.

Md. Zafar Iqbal is a prolific writer, the author of more than 220 books on science, mathematics, science fiction and novels. His books earned him numerous awards including the prestigious national Bangla Academy Award. Many of his novels have been dramatized into movies and telefilms. He is a popular columnist and his biweekly column is published simultaneously in 25 national and online newspapers. His columns in the newspapers on current issues have become very popular and has made a significant impact on various policy decisions of the government. He has written several tele-dramas, among which is a UN-assisted television serial stressing the necessity of education for underprivileged children.

Dr. Iqbal was an important member of the drafting committee of the National Education Policy 2010 of Bangladesh. He is a devoted social activist and has mobilized a nationwide movement to popularize science, mathematics and computer programming among the children of Bangladesh.

Tonight's distinguished speakers



Mohammad Ataul Karim is a scientist and Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor of the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth with expertise in electro-optical systems, optical computing, and pattern recognition. Karim is ranked amongst the top 50 researchers who contributed most to Applied Optics in its 50-year history. He was for 9 years the first Vice President for Research of Old Dominion University (ODU) in Norfolk, Virginia.

Karim earned his master's degrees in physics and electrical engineering, and a doctor of philosophy in electrical engineering from University of Alabama.

He leads the International Conference on Computer and Information Technology, now in its 16th year. Since 2009, with assistance of 5 teams of guest editors, Karim produced 20 journal special issues that featured works of Bangladesh-based researchers in the fields of communications, computing, multimedia, networks, and software.

Karim began creative writing in high school. A large number of his popular science writings in Bengali appeared in Bigyan Shamoeeki and Bangla Academy Bigyan Patrika during 1972–1976. Of these, the most significant were Biborthon Kahinee, a series of articles on cosmic and biological evolution, and Shamproteek, a monthly feature of current affairs in science, both of which appeared in Bigyan Shamoeeki. His efforts to correct illegal practices that otherwise discriminated against international graduate students was featured by the Chronicle of Higher Education, The Wall Street Journal in "Hidden Costs of a Brain Gain" and in turn by David Heenan in his book "Flight Capital: The Alarming Exodus of America's Best And Brightest".

STILL WE STRIVE

[The whole world is now going through the trauma of COVID-19 pandemic and Bangladesh is no different. The normal life of people is severely hampered. Most of the government and non-government offices, educational institutions, markets, and businesses operate partially or not at all. Even under these bleak conditions CLP and its implementation partner in Bangladesh, Dnet are trying to use any opportunity to move on.

CLP is organizing its Annual Event online on October 3, 2020. Dnet is trying to keep different CLP activities in Bangladesh continuing. A young CLP volunteer in the United States finds his Connect Students around the World project on hold. What follows is a brief account of their efforts.]

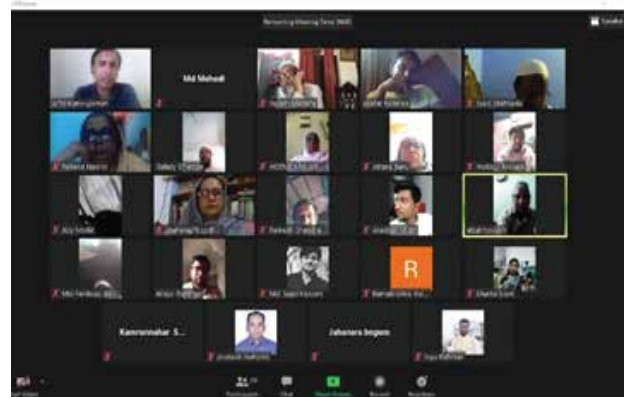
CLP activities Bangladesh during COVID-19

Schools are closed. So, it is not possible to conduct the regular CLP activities such as visiting schools for monitoring purpose, establishing new centers that require physical presence at the schools, holding computer training sessions at CLCs, and so on. Some of the activities that Dnet has undertaken in Bangladesh to keep moving are the following.

First is the involvement in Nextgenedu (Next-generation education), an initiative of the Bangladesh Government's education wing, A2I (Access to Information). The aim is to design new education approaches for academic institutions for addressing the COVID 19 challenges.

Second, Dnet started online meetings with CLP-affiliated schools for discussing and developing approaches to continue CLP activities during COVID 19 and beyond. Some of the schools are interested to conduct online classes using social media. They requested us to organize online training for their capacity building so that they can conduct online classes. Furthermore, we would also continue our center establishment and hardware replacement and technical support activities so that the teachers can use computers for preparing digital contents.



Third, CLP has already started an online training program on various topics with 33 teachers from five different institutions across the country. The institutions are Ati Panchdona High School, Krishnapur Govt. Primary School, Upazila Sadar Model Govt. Primary School, Sherpur Town Colony AJ High School, and Alhaj Amzad Hossain Degree College. Eleven centers are to be established in these institutions. Some of the main training topics are highlighted below.

- a. Computer Fundamentals Training: Computer Fundamental Training aims to train the teachers

about basic computer operations as well as using some of the core Microsoft Office applications, such as, MS Word, MS PowerPoint, MS Excel, MS Paint, etc.

b. Digital Pedagogy Training: The aim is to develop the teachers' expertise in conducting effective online multimedia classes using digital technology and appropriate pedagogical knowledge. After receiving the training, they will know how digital pedagogy can be used best and how much impact it can create on students' learning capability and willingness.

c. Facilitating the SCR: The teachers are being trained to conduct Smart Classrooms (SCRs) effectively. In this part of the training, some quick and easy classroom-usable-tools have been shared with them for making the class more interesting to the students.

d. Developing Contents for SCR: There are some sessions on developing content for use in the classrooms. In this part of the training, teachers are taught how to create content not only by using the MS PowerPoint but also to generate video content using simple video editing applications.

e. Training of Teachers: The assigned CLC teachers are receiving training which instructs them on the purpose and process of conducting the students' computer training using the "let's cheer, do, and share" methodology.

As per feedback from the participants, the training is helping them immensely to improve the respective topics and they are quite hopeful to be utilizing the acquired knowledge in the classrooms. The next on the agenda is conducting a refreshers' training for the project teachers of CLP's 79 supported schools. All the aforementioned training segments will be included in the refreshers' training.

Since the COVID-19 invasion of Bangladesh, the Government's Education Department instructed the schools to offer online classes. So far 18 out of 79 CLP's supported schools have been able to start online classes. Unfortunately, only 15 to 20 per cent of the total students can attend online classes, because of the lack of required equipment and inhibiting Internet costs. Eight of these 18 schools use Zoom to hold their online classes, and the remainder use video sharing services such as YouTube and social media networks, such as, Facebook. In addition, teachers from another 22 CLP-affiliated schools use Upazila-based YouTube channels to upload video materials which help many students who cannot attend live classes. In some instances students who are not able to avail themselves of any of these opportunities receive phone calls on a weekly or monthly basis at their parents' mobile phone and receive some guidance to continue their education.

In addition, Dnet is also planning to introduce the so-called "Tele-education" aimed at providing instruction over mobile phone by volunteer teachers, each of them will be responsible for a group of students. Alongside this, the students and their parents will be guided and advised by specialists regarding psychological and mental-health issues.

CLP is trying to start establishing the centers that were due last year. Dnet has sent some of the hardware that was purchased for the respective schools before COVID-19. Dnet has also sent replacement for the unrepairable hardware in our existing supported schools.

We realize that these efforts are no substitutes for regular face-to-face classes that all students can attend. However, until we return to normal conditions or settle on a "new normal," these efforts keep little lamps of learning, however flickering, burning.

COVID-19 Interrupted My Attempt to Start a CSAW Project

I have been volunteering at Computer Literacy Program (CLP) events and attending the annual fund raising function since 2017. I was particularly inspired by a talk given by Ms. Jill Stedronsky, an English teacher at in 2018 the William Annin Middle School (WAMS), Basking Ridge, in the 2018 annual event. She talked about her experience with the CSAW (Connect Students around the World) project. The CSAW project objective is to foster cultural communication, friendship, and understanding between youths living in the different corners of the world. Through the CSAW project she connected the students in her language arts class with the students in the English club of a high school in Bangladesh. The students on two sides of the world would work on a common project, produce a video on their work and exchange their videos and then engage in an online conference to talk and learn from each other. After seeing how much excitement it generated and benefited students in both the U.S and Bangladesh, I decided to start a similar program at my own local (Hopewell, NJ) middle school.

During the winter break of 2018 I visited Ghorashal Pilot High School (GPHS), a school established by my great-grandfather. Like many rural Bangladeshi schools, it is filled with children who are capable and enthusiastic about learning, despite the lack of resources available to them. I felt that a program connecting their school with ours in suburban NJ would have many benefits, including enriching the students' worldview and encouraging Bangladeshi kids to improve their fluency in English. I proposed my program to the headmaster, who agreed to incorporate it into his school's English Club.

Establishing the program in New Jersey proved to be difficult and filled with logistical and bureaucratic hurdles. I had several meetings with the Hopewell district social studies director, who helped convince the school administrators to endorse the project, and convince the teachers to oversee it. We were presented with many challenges, such as how to deal with the time zone difference, language barrier and scheduling, as well as lack of necessary technology at GPHS. Through more discussions (including a conference call with Ms. Stedronsky), we were able to develop a full-fledged program. GPHS already had a Computer Literacy Center and a Smart Class Room. However, the school needed a 55 inch-screen television and electronic equipment to support live audio-video conferencing. A generous donor provided funds for those.

By 2020 we had a teacher, plenty of student participants, and a well-developed plan: over the course of a few months, students from each side would exchange questions through emails and written letters, as well as send each other video presentations about their hometown, school, and daily schedule. At the end of the program, a video call between the two schools would take place where the two groups could have a conversation in real time.

Unfortunately, about three weeks into the program, school was cancelled indefinitely, and the program came to a halt. We look forward to continue the program, when schools open back up.

My Experience in CLP's Long-Distance Teaching

My time working with the Bangladeshi-American community began when my parents got me involved in the CLP's youth volunteer group at the organization's annual fundraiser. As a youth volunteer, I was responsible for multiple tasks such as greeting CLP patrons and collecting donations at the entrance, babysitting younger kids that came to the function, decorating the venue for the event, and facilitating live Q & A sessions between CLP officers and the patrons.

After working two annual fundraisers, I wanted to explore if there was more I could do beyond basic youth volunteering to enhance my experience. That is when I discovered CLP's newly established Long-Distance Teaching program. CLP emphasized the program as a way for volunteers to directly impact the underprivileged community in Bangladesh. I also saw this as a way to help educate the underprivileged youth, the foundation of Bangladesh's future.

Initially, I researched the program and got into contact with Ms. Rittika Shamsuddin, one of the tutors who were responsible for starting the program. Through connecting and discussing with Rittika, I learned how to establish a course, to develop a curriculum, to contact the school staff via email, schedule virtual calls through Skype, and even how to have simple conversations with the students and connect with them on a personal level. Her mentoring truly helped me solidify my understanding of the program.

Eventually, I decided to teach the students English grammar and reading comprehension. Immediately, I began developing my curriculum. The focal points of the course centered on utilizing hand-picked grade-level books to facilitate understanding. The books would be used to show students real-life examples of how different English punctuation rules are used, how to build sentences, how to pronounce and write new vocabulary and how to use different literary elements to put a story together.

Using this structure, my first few classes turned out to be better than expected. While many of the students were very reserved in our first few meetings, I saw the raw emotion of enjoyment and fascination in their eyes as we read and simultaneously took notes as well as went along in the book. Over time, they became more open with me. It came to a point where the students and I learned about each other's lives outside of school, understanding both the commonalities and differences between our lives.

Despite this success, there were still some minor drawbacks. While Skype provided excellent video calling for the classes and screen-sharing features, I was limited in my ability to share live annotations with the students for them to transcribe on their notepads and help them grasp difficult concepts. Moreover, I also began to feel that just reading and taking notes may not be the best facilitator of learning for the children.

This realization got me researching alternative online education tools to propose to CLP and implement them into the teaching program. I introduced the Zoom video calling software. It featured a white-board option that was perfect for the live instruction and real-time note-taking I was looking for. Additionally, I resorted to teaching tools such as Kahoot and Quizlet that my high school here in the US used for class. Both served engaging platforms I could use with my students for retention activities. CLP agreed with the proposal and integrated these tools into the program.

The outcome of using these tools was fruitful. The Zoom whiteboard option made the learning experience more wholesome as I had more ways of explaining concepts that are hard to grasp. I could now draw visual examples or list down key terms in real-time. Kahoot's quiz-like competitiveness kept the students fully invested, eagerly raising their hand to answer the next question when it appeared on the screen. Quizlet served as an excellent ice-breaker for the students and me to start our lessons and directly dive into the new topics we had coming up in the curriculum.

Witnessing such positive growth in the program, CLP allowed me to speak about my experience as an online tutor during the annual fundraising event. I used this opportunity to not only discuss the positive change this specific CLP program is bringing to the underprivileged youth of Bangladesh but how it helped me to connect with my roots. As an American with Bangladeshi heritage, talking and connecting with the children helped me further understand what life is like in rural Bangladesh and how vastly different our lives are.

When I started volunteering for CLP's long-distance teaching program, I simply wanted to live up to the noble precedence many members of the Bangladeshi-American community have set in utilizing their strengths towards bringing real substantial change to Bangladesh. More importantly, I wanted to leave my mark. So, when the President's Volunteer Service Award (PVSA) was introduced into CLP as a way for volunteers to be recognized for their involvement, I took a chance and applied for it. CLP reviewed my volunteer efforts and found that I fulfilled their requirements for earning PVSA. I am grateful to CLP for believing in my volunteer effort and presenting me with this award. This would not have been possible without the help of my mentor Rittika, the leadership of Dr. Mohammad Farooque, the support of my parents, and other members of the Bangladeshi-American community.

Beyond PVSA, CLP's continued support in my volunteering efforts inspired me to do something greater for their cause. I decided to personally travel to Bangladesh as a representative of CLP and visit the village school of my students in Boitpur, Bagerhat, Bangladesh. The experience was eye opening when I witnessed how different the school system was for the children in comparison to my own. I also observed the extraordinary job CLP has done in establishing a virtual learning environment for these children. I am proud to have been a part of this significant CLP program.

A Visit to Suapur Nannar High School CLC and SCR

Sajid Hossain and Mr. Ruba-E-Raihan picked up visiting CLP volunteer Dr. Farrukh Mohsen and his guest. We planned to reach the school ahead of the school start time of 10:30 AM. Computer Literacy Program (CLP) established a Computer Literacy Center (CLC) and a Smart Classrooms (SCR) in the school in May 2009 under sponsorship from NABIC, USA. Our goal was to observe how the CLC and the SCR were operating.

We were received by the Head teacher, Md. Asharul Islam when we arrived at 9.30 AM. Mr. Islam informed us that currently the school 1635 students (Girls: 781) were attending the school. School staff included 31 teachers (8 female); The school has currently 7 buildings (2 buildings are currently expanding). three security guards, one-night guard, and other support staff. The school then had 7 buildings (two of those were being expanded). There were 24 classrooms, 3 office rooms and a store room.



The school conducts 9 batches of CLC training graduating 54 students (9 X 6) every year from the program. More students benefit from the SCR. Since the inception in 2009, approximately 515 students graduated from the CLC and 4,872 students received benefits from the SCR. of smart classrooms. The school had 5 CPUs, 3 UPSs, 12 monitors, 3 laptops, 3 printers, one modem, 3 projectors, and one solar panel operational when we visited.

The head teacher was highly appreciative of CLP's ICT initiative. He described that in 2009 the students were virtually unaware of computer and afraid to operate computers. Over the last 10 years, that fright has been replaced by enthusiasm, and desire to improve efficiency at every level – academic, administrative and accounting. Now the school does all sorts of administrative work, and most importantly communicates via e-mails with education department of the Bangladesh government. Recently the school introduced close circuit cameras in classrooms and different corners of the school for monitoring purposes and communicating with class-room teachers. Interestingly, the Head Teacher announced our class room visit over the CCTV. The CC TV also helps with the security of the hardware in the CLC. The CLC also helps teachers in developing digital contents for presentation in classroom.

Introduction of ICT in the school had a significant positive impact on the learning process because of a joyful and interactive environment. Head teacher also stated that curiously, junior students are relatively more eager to receive computer training than their elders perhaps because of progressively greater awareness of the benefits and importance of ICT.

We took a tour of the school surroundings and observed assembly of students and classrooms. We



had the privilege to observe teacher Fazlul Huq Khan's SCR session of Class X students. Mr. Khan had a PowerPoint presentation on flood and its causes, a very relevant topic for Bangladesh. Mr. Khan had prepared the presentation largely from Bangladesh Government's portal for teachers' "Shikkhok Batayon". Following the presentation students were divided into small groups for in-group discussions. One student from each group was invited to make an oral presentation in front of the entire class. It was encouraging to note the confidence the student presenters had. Mr. Khan then assigned a home work on the topic.

We spent some time in the CLC lab. Unfortunately, the teacher assigned to the CLC was absent. Another teacher described to us the activities undertaken in the CLC. We also observed a regular (non-CLP) class. There the teacher introduced the 'Helio Centric System' to students in Class VII. We participated in the question and answer session.

Suapur Nannar High school is implementing the CLP program successfully. We found the students enthusiastic and the teachers motivated. There are still some problems with the Internet connection.

We would like to reflect on some interesting trends. First, the guardians today pay more attention to provide their daughters with proper education than in the past. Second, the enhancement of self-confidence among female students has been remarkable. One of us (FM) has been visiting CLCs for over a decade. Along with many obvious improvements, what has been most noticeable over this period is the unmistakable enhancement of self-confidence and demeanor of female students. While the few girls who were fortunate to attend rural schools in the past would be shy, today's girls exude self-confidence and an eagerness for self-improvement.

We were also impressed by a practice introduced by the School Management. Teachers visit students' houses before their public and school examination to discuss with the guardian the academic progress of the student including progress in computer learning.
