

A silver lining in the dark clouds of COVID-19: Digital Connectivity

The seventeenth year of CLP started amidst the pandemic and continued through lock downs and school closings as mutations of the virus ravaged not only Bangladesh, but also the whole world. CLP and Dnet continued to build on the interventions introduced before the pandemic, strived to stay relevant and keep the roots of key CLP programs healthy. Recent advances in digital connectivity [cell phone, Internet, social media and Smart Class Rooms (SCRs)] turned out as a silver lining in the dark clouds of COVID-19.

Remote voluntary teaching (RVT) had been gaining momentum in recent years, drawing volunteer teachers of different age groups (high school students, recent graduates, retired professionals and a senior college professor) from home and abroad. In a poetic twist, RVT made the underprivileged students in an orphanage in Gazipur among the most privileged. Here is their story. Nashwaan Khan, a high school senior from California, wanted to gain volunteer teaching experience, contacted CLP, received warm welcome, but learned that with schools closed there was no class for him to teach. Unless he could raise half of the funds (CLP pays the rest) necessary to establish a SCR at the orphanage, which being a residential facility would have students to attend remote classes. Undaunted, Nashwaan went ahead to organize his friends, raised funds, got the SCR established and started teaching English to the sixth, seventh and eighth graders in the orphanage. Then Fera Foundation, Inc. (FF), a not-for-profit organization based in New York City joined hands and provided the remote teaching services of several volunteer teachers. Under normal circumstances students from the orphanage used to attend nearby township schools. With those schools closed, the orphanage was able to run over 30 classes covering different subjects within its own premises using the distant instruction resources of its SCR!

CLP and Dnet organized several meetings and training sessions throughout the year. The CLP-Dnet-FF team hosted a highly appreciated online primary school teachers training session by an experienced teacher trainer from the New York City Education system focusing on Student Engagement Strategies. A *virtual training session for CLP school teachers* brought 107 teachers from 77 CLP-affiliated schools who received training from Dnet professionals on how to teach classes using social media that students can connect to using cell phones. The trained teachers later used the tool to connect with and teach students. Dnet organized another *virtual conference between teachers and sponsors* of CLCs and SCRs. The event seemed to energize the teachers as it was a welcome relief from their isolation. The sponsors appreciated meeting with the teachers and learning how their sponsored centers had been operating. A valuable recommendation, organizing refresher and updated annual training sessions for teachers came out of the conference; and will be implemented. The teacher-sponsor conferences may be useful for rejuvenating the centers that are not currently supported. Another promising development is that teachers from several non-CLP schools, that have computers but lack any structured program, approached Dnet about the feasibility of implementing the CLP curriculum in their schools. CLP youth volunteers are raising funds to help start the project that will cost only \$5 to provide a student with basic CLP training.



Wahiduddin Mahmud obtained Ph.D. in economics from Cambridge University and was until recently Professor of Economics at Dhaka University. He is currently a member of the UN Committee for Development Policy (UN-CDP) and Chairman of South Asia Network of Economic Research Institutes (SANEI). He has led many government committees and commissions in Bangladesh relating to bank reforms, national income estimation, agricultural reforms, poverty monitoring and chaired or currently chairs the Panel of Economists for the Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Five-Year Plans of Bangladesh. He was a member of the Caretaker Government of Bangladesh in 1996 in charge

of the Ministry of Finance and Planning. Together with Nobel Laureate Professor Muhammad Yunus, he was a founder and, until recently, Chairman of PKSF (Bangladesh's apex microcredit funding institution). He has held visiting and research appointments at IDS at Sussex University, International Food Policy Research Institute, International Growth Centre at LSE, UNDP, ILO and the World Bank, among other institutions. His books include Adjustment and Beyond: the Reform Experience in South Asia (Palgrave-Macmillan), Handbook on the South Asian Economies (Edward Elgar), Seasonality of Hunger and Public Policies (World Bank publications) and The Theory and Practice of Microcredit (Routledge).



Faisal Quader has spent twenty-five years in the field of Engineering and Information Science as an industry leader. He holds a Ph.D. in Cybersecurity & Data Science from the University of Maryland. His academic interests are in Cybersecurity, Data Mining, Human-computer Interaction, R&D process optimization as well as Health IT. He actively participates in IEEE and ACM. He is the recipient of a number of academic and industry awards and certified in multiple standards including

Six Sigma. Faisal has numerous publications on cybersecurity and data mining.

Faisal spent more than fifteen years with General Electric and Lockheed Martin Corporation. At GE he oversaw an off-shore development center, re-engineered multiple business processes for cost optimization and improved efficiency and provided direction to new product lines. As a senior manager of GE, Faisal helped grow the RLD division at an offshore facility from ten to six hundred employees over a span of seven years. He brought his technical and management expertise with Fortune100 corporations developed during his tenure with these multinational organizations to new technology startups. In 2007, he co-founded TISTA Science and Technology and provided leadership roles until 2013 when he co-founded the current organization, Technuf. His current interest as the President of his organization is in emerging technology that includes collaboration application development for mobile platforms, cybersecurity, cloud computing and forensic analysis embedded in Big Data.

Faisal has closely worked with both federal, civilian and defense organizations in defining cybersecurity countermeasures to ensure the protection of federal assets with Identity Access Management, Deep Packet Capture, Forensic Analysis and E-Discovery and litigation support. He is also a researcher in human behavior analytics for smart cars.

Faisal is passionate about serving his community and in the past has served in the leadership role as the chair of a number of non-profit organizations including professional engineering bodies. Faisal also loves music. He is an active singer and involved with numerous cultural activities. He is married with two children and lives in Bethesda, Maryland.

Remote Voluntary Teaching

How effective is remote teaching? How does a remote class experience compare with that of a face-to-face class? These questions have been raised many times from many different pulpits and platforms ever since advances in instructional technology made online, distant instruction feasible; and more so during this pandemic that shut down schools and put in-person classes on hold around the globe. While the jury is still out, one observation is clear that there may be no all-encompassing single answer. Answers to the questions will depend on many factors that include resources of the institution, socio-economic background of the students attending the school, availability of trained teachers and aspects of interpersonal communications.

The Computer Literacy Program (CLP) initiated remote voluntary teaching on a limited scale few years ago. Volunteer teachers from the US and other countries have been teaching primary and high school students in rural Bangladesh. The project uses the infrastructure of a Smart Class Room (SCR), with some improvisations, for distant instruction. The experiment has generated considerable interest among students, teachers of those students, parents and volunteers of different age groups eager to teach. This article features the experiences and observations of four individuals engaged in this experiment.

Shirin Siddiqui, a professor of Chemistry at Elizabeth City State University in North Carolina, writes about her teaching of Chemistry to high school students of the Uddipan Badar-Shamsu Bidya Niketan (UBSBN) at Boitpur, Bagerhat. Not only does she bring her knowledge of chemistry and teaching skills honed over the years to the class, but also her background of growing up in a similar rural setting and her life experience. She naturally becomes a role model for her students. The experience gives her the satisfaction of being able to give back to the broader community that nurtured her and helps her make a significant decision about her future plans. Dipankar Pal is the headmaster and chemistry teacher at UBSBN. He attends the class that Professor Siddiqui teaches. The interaction is beneficial to both of them and truly enriching for the students. Several other classes and subjects at UBSBN are taught in part by remote instructors. In his article Mr. Pal presents how these volunteer teachers help him to provide quality instruction in subjects for which well-trained teacher are hard to recruit and retain in his rural school.

Nashwaan Ali Khan, a high school senior from Cerritos, California wanted to obtain some volunteering experience as high school students in the US commonly do. His fascinating piece tells how that pursuit made him raise funds to help establish a SCR at an orphanage in Gazipur, organize his friends to participate, bring out the leader in him and of course teach English to the students at the orphanage. He garners a US President's Volunteer Service Award (PVSA) Gold medal for his exemplary activities. Rafa Sattar, a young professional and the founder and president of Fera (means return in Bengali) Foundation, talks about building a community of trained volunteer teachers motivated to teach students in Bangladesh, and how collaboration with CLP is making that possible.

While we have not provided any definitive answers to the key questions, we believe these four pieces shine light to the interesting and consequential issue of distant teaching from different angles.

Reflections on My Remote Teaching Experience as a CLP Volunteer

Teaching chemistry to high school students of the Uddipan Badar-Shamsu Bidya Niketan (UBSBN) of Boitpur, Bagerhat, especially doing it via Zoom, did not interest me, at first. Farooque Bhai (Dr. Mohammad Farooque) insisted, and pretty much convinced me and imposed upon me to do so! I realized then why Farooque Bhai was a successful leader of a renowned fuel-cell energy company. He recognized who was capable of the doing a job and knew how to get that person to do it. I tried to use the excuse of not having a camera on my dinosaur-age laptop, so a camera and a speaker soon arrived by mail to my North Carolina apartment. Thus began my journey of teaching the high school students in a Bangladeshi school.

I grew up in rural Bangladesh, mainly in the-then districts of Khulna and Jessore, wherever my police officer father (abba) used to be posted. I did my Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examination from Kachua Coronation Shobhan Bilateral High School in Kachua, Bagerhat, Khulna in 1968. Abba was the Officer in Charge (OC) of Police of Kachua thana (now upazila). My school was accredited because of my being placed in the first division in the SSC examination. A big celebration took place, 500 takas were spent on sweets and the school was closed for three days! Abba promised me that if I did well in my SSC exam, he would send me to Dacca for college. I left home for college when I was sixteen; never went back to Kachua, but Kachua, Bagerhat and Khulna have remained in my heart forever!

So, teaching for UBSBN, in Kachua was not hard, the area was already in my heart. The students I teach are mostly female and conservative (most wear hijabs). The textbook (I received a virtual copy) covers similar materials as does the one we use here in the USA for the introductory two-semester general chemistry course in a four-year college chemistry program. The main difference is in the language (Bengali vs. English). I was impressed by the standard of the textbook.

I dress up every Friday night at 10 PM (or 11 PM, depending on daylight saving practice in the US) in my saree and "tip." I didn't want to drop my tip, which I have used all my life. I understand most Bangladeshi Muslim women, especially those of my age, do not use it anymore. I wanted my students to know that the tradition existed when I grew up. The Headmaster, Mr. Dipankar Paul, who is also the Chemistry instructor at UBSBN, is always present in the class. It works two ways, he helps me with writing on blackboard sometimes and with some of the Bangla Chemical Terms which I might have forgotten, or which might have been introduced in the vocabulary after I left Bangladesh. He can also see my way of explaining things which might be different from his. With my new SurfacePro computer I can write as done in an actual classroom and that enhanced my teaching quality. Dipankar's help made that writing process easier and faster.

Students feel comfortable in the class. They are curious about my life, my family and my background. I share easily, I share often. I feel they can learn chemistry from any source, in this age of internet and self-teaching, I am not adding much dimension there. What I am adding is my life's experience. Being a graduate of Kachua High School, now I am a chemistry professor at Elizabeth City State University, (ECSU), a four-year college in the United States of America. I am a successful professor; my students love me, like to learn with me. What I add is that while we have no control over where we were born, our gender, our religious backgrounds, but we have control over our inner spirits, our desire to do well for ourselves, for our environments, for our society, for our mother earth. Being born a girl in a lower middle-class family in Bangladesh and being educated in a remote village high school did not prevent me from working shoulder to shoulder with world class scientists in AT&T Bell Labs and in Texas Instruments (TI) in the USA.

I even have cultural exchanges with my UBSBN students; they sing songs and I recite poems. I try to impose upon them that literature is important, communication is important. Science and technology are important but without communication that development will have no home in our minds. How much chemistry I can convey to them is hard to measure, it is hard to measure even in my classes in the US. Some of the students get it, retain it, many do not and that is common for any subject, for any place. Most people misunderstand chemistry; think it involves memorization with no reasoning. This may be true at the lower levels just the way we had to memorize alphabets or numbers. But eventually it must make sense, it must have an explanation. Why electrons move around in orbits, we cannot just say they do, we must be able to explain why.

This experience of teaching Bangladeshi high school students has influenced me considerably. It helped me decide to retire in two years. I was thinking of working for as long as my body and mind permitted. But this experience helped me decide that I would teach high school students in my village as a volunteer after retiring. I will continue to be with UBSBN, if they want my service but my focus will be my village. I plan to live in Barguna for three months to teach in person, and do so for the rest of the year from USA via Zoom. My excitement to teach in rural Bangladeshi high schools is so high that it is making my remaining two years of active service at ECSU, a difficult one. But I will keep my promise. These are my plans; now let us see what Allah's plans are.

I feel so much at peace with the decision that I will be able to give back to my motherland, she gave me so much. I feel that my departed ancestors: Dadu (grandfather), Dadi (grandmother), Boro Chacha Mia (father's older brother), Abba (father), Amma (mother), my six Fupi Ammas (father's sisters) will be happy. I want to visit UBSBN; I want to visit my alma mater, Kachua High School (now Government C. S. Pilot High School). I want to meet my headmaster, who at that time seemed like a mountain of knowledge and power that kept me moving towards my goals! I probably will not be able to find my Bangla teacher, Mr. Rabindra Nath Saha (how appropriate a name for a Bangla teacher!) who tried to instill in me how to focus on the topic (in his words, write essay on the cow, instead of taking it for a bath in the river, and getting busy describing the beauty of river!). That is how my Bangla teacher, steered a sixteen-year old to remain on topic. I want to inspire my Bangladeshi students with my story of the power of education.

একটি গ্রামীণ স্কুলে দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রমের অভিজ্ঞতা

২০১৭ সাল থেকে উদ্দীপন বদর-সামছু বিদ্যানিকেতনে কম্পিউটার লিটারেসি প্রোগ্রামের (CLP, সিএলপি) দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম শুরু করা হয়। আমরা লক্ষ্য করতাম, স্কুলের ছাত্রছাত্রীরা ইংরেজি ও গণিত বিষয়ে দু'টিতে বিশেষভাবে দুর্বল। স্থানীয়ভাবে এ দুটি বিষয়ে ভাল শিক্ষক পাওয়া যায় না। স্কুল প্রতিষ্ঠার পর থেকে আমরা বছরে দু'বার বাংলাদেশের বিভিন্ন বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের ছাত্র ও শিক্ষকদের নিয়ে এ দুই বিষয় শেখানোর ওপর কর্মশালার আয়োজন করি। ২০১১ সাল থেকে স্মার্ট ক্লাসরুমের মাধ্যমে আমাদের ছাত্রছাত্রীদের শিক্ষার গুণগত মান বৃদ্ধির কার্যক্রম শুরু করি। দেখা যায় কর্মশালা ও স্মার্ট ক্লাসরুম উদ্যোগ আংশিক সফল হলেও আমাদের প্রত্যাশা পুরোপুরি পূরণ করছে না। আমাদের আরো একটি প্রত্যাশা ছিল দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম শিক্ষক সমস্যার সমাধানে সহায়তা করতে পারে।

দূরপ্রশিক্ষণের প্রাথমিক পর্যায়ে ষষ্ঠ থেকে অষ্টম শেণির গনিত ও ইংরেজির ক্লাস শুরু করি। এ কার্যক্রম ছাত্রছাত্রী ও অভিভাবকের মাঝে সাড়া জাগায়। যায় যে বিজ্ঞান বিষয়সমূহে (পদার্থবিদ্যা, উচ্চতর গনিত ও রসায়ন) দুর্বলতা রয়ে গেছে। এ দুর্বলতা দূর করার জন্য আমরা এসব বিষয়েও দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম শুরু করি। নবম ও দশম শেণির বিজ্ঞানের ছাত্রছাত্রীদের এ কার্যক্রমের আওতায় আনা হয়। আমরা আরো লক্ষ্য করি, ষষ্ঠ শেণির ছাত্রছাত্রীদের গনিত, ইংরেজি ও শুদ্ধ কথা বলায় সমস্যা অপেক্ষাকৃত বেশি হয়। তাই আমরা ২০১৯ সাল থেকে চতুর্থ ও পঞ্চম শ্রেণির ছাত্রছাত্রীদেরকেও দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রমের আওতায় আনি।

বর্তমানে প্রবাসী বাংলাদেশী ছাড়াও ভিনদেশী শিক্ষকগণ ও স্কুলের দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম সংযুক্ত রয়েছেন। এই কার্যক্রমের মাধ্যমে বিদেশী ছাত্রছাত্রী ও শিক্ষকদের সাথেও আমাদের ছাত্রছাত্রীদের পরিচয় ঘটছে। এছাড়া বছরে দু'বার যুক্তরাষ্ট্রের নিউজার্সি রাজ্যের William Annin Middle School (WAMS) এর শিক্ষার্থীদের সাথে আমাদের স্কুলের ছাত্রছাত্রীরা বিভিন্ন বিষয়ে তথ্য ও মতামত আদান প্রদান করছে। কোভিডের কারণে স্কুল বন্ধু থাকার সময় আমরা দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রমের মাধ্যমে ছাত্রছাত্রীদের সাথে যোগাযোগ ও তাদের পড়ালেখার বিষয়ে খোঁজ-খবর নেয়া অব্যাহত রাখতে পেরেছি। দূরপ্রশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম বিদ্যালয়ের শিক্ষার গুণগত মান যথেষ্ঠ বৃদ্ধি করেছে। আমাদের শিক্ষকদের দক্ষতা বৃদ্ধি পাচেছ।

বিশেষভাবে উল্লেখ্য, এই দূরশিক্ষণ কার্যক্রম অভিজ্ঞতা কাজে লাগিয়ে প্রতিষ্ঠানের সহায়ক স্বাস্থ্য কার্যক্রম টেলিমেডিসিন ব্যবহার শুরু করা হয়েছে। সামনের দিনে এ কার্যক্রম উদ্দীপন বদর-সামছু বিদ্যানিকেতনকে উন্নততর পর্যায়ে পৌঁছাতে সহায়তা করবে। ইতোমধ্যে এই বিদ্যালয়ের কোনো কোনো ছাত্রছাত্রীদের মধ্যে যুক্তরাষ্ট্রের নামকরা বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ে উচ্চ শিক্ষা গ্রহণ করার স্পৃহা জেগেছে।

পরিশেষে সি.এল.পি এবং সি.এল.পি ভলান্টিয়ার শিক্ষকদের ধন্যবাদ জানাই তাঁদের এই মহান উদ্যোগ আমাদেরকে অন্তর্ভুক্ত করার জন্য।

Remote Voluntary Teaching and Infrastructure Building

I first learned about the activities of the Computer Literacy Program (CLP) approximately a year ago at a Halaqa (a meeting for the study of Islam and the Quran), where Dr. Molla Huq talked about building Computer Learning Centers (CLCs) and Smart Class Rooms (SCRs) in Sherpur, Bangladesh. I have an avid interest in computers and information technology, so these two CLP projects attracted my attention right away. My father and I contacted Dr. Molla Huq and soon I got in touch with Dr. Farooque, the President of CLP. I was much impressed to find out how the CLP volunteers and expatriate Bangladeshi donors are giving back to the communities where they grew up.


After discussing with Dr. Farooque and Dr. Mohsen, Vice President of CLP, I became a young CLP volunteer. I wanted to teach English to underprivileged Bangladeshi children. The only problem was: I had no classes to teach, as the schools in Bangladesh were closed due to the pandemic. However, one choice came up, which was to teach students in an orphanage in Gazipur, a residential facility. The orphanage did not have a SCR, that is, the infrastructure needed for conducting distance classes. Dr. Farooque mentioned that if I could raise half of the funds needed to establish a SCR at Gazipur, CLP would provide the rest.

I took it as a challenge. I realized that I can do something alone, but it would be much more effective and efficient if I had a team. I contacted my friends. Some of them were interested and soon we had a chapter in California which I would lead. Now my team has branches in New York City, Sydney, New Jersey and Cerritos. We even have members who are not of Bangladeshi origin. We set out to raise funds. Soon a SCR was established at the orphanage in Gazipur, and my remote voluntary teaching adventure began.

I have been teaching English to students in the orphanage for several months now. Some of my team members got involved. It is amazing to see that some of my non-Bengali teammates are able to communicate with the students in the orphanage and are teaching well. I realized that if the students learn how to communicate well in English, they will be able to work both inside and outside of Bangladesh when they join the workforce. My students taught me that they can learn anything if they are provided with necessary tools and instruction. We have gone from the stage where students were not able to understand the fable "The Hare and the Tortoise" to being able to discuss how their week was and write letters in English!

Meanwhile we keep expanding our team of volunteers and raise funds. Recently, we (Sai Akhil Samatham, Vice President of our chapter and I) went to the City Hall of Cerritos, the town where we live, urging support for our initiative. We are exploring other avenues.

I feel a special bond with the students of the orphanage. So, when we were celebrating the Eid this year, my family sponsored a feast for the children in the orphanage and provided gifts for students in my class. On a personal note, I was gratified when Dr. Farooque informed me that I had been awarded the US President's



Volunteer Service Award (PVSA) in recognition of my volunteering activities. I consider it an honor not only for myself, but also for my teammates who trusted me and helped, and for my students who strived!

Building a Remote Instructor Community

Rafa Sattar

At Fera Foundation, we seek to help the most marginalized communities in Bangladesh via charitable remote services. Through our dynamic partnership with CLP USA, we hope to expand remote schooling to underprivileged children in rural schools across the country. Most recently, we have launched the CARE (Countering Adversity via Remote Education) Teaching Fellowship to recruit a highly-qualified, committed cohort of remote teachers.

We use a rigorous recruitment process for the teachers we seek to place with CLP USA's school partners. Each remote volunteer teacher is matched based on credentials, subject preferences and availability. Our remote schooling program provides teachers with comprehensive English as a Second Language (ESL) lesson plans and the Bangladesh National Curriculum and Textbook Board's entire Bangla-medium textbook collection from Class 1-11. Furthermore, all of our remote teachers receive training from licensed teaching professionals based in the United States. With CLP, we most recently held a training session with the staff of several rural schools in Bangladesh. We hope to continue holding training sessions on a regular basis to share the latest teaching strategies used in the US to ensure that both on-site and remote teachers follow best practices in the classroom.

We have successfully piloted our remote schooling program at several orphanages in Bangladesh and look forward to expanding to smart classrooms in schools affiliated with CLP. We share a common vision with CLP of achieving education equity across Bangladesh through distance education.

Sixteen Years of Dnet's Journey with CLP

Dnet started its journey as a not-for-profit social enterprise 20 years ago with the aim of supporting marginalized women, children and youth through development interventions. Dnet has been working in the education sector with CLP USA since 2005 to empower underprivileged youths through computer literacy training and technology-aided education. Over these years, Dnet helped implement different CLP projects, such as Computer Literacy Center (CLC), Smart Class Room (SCR), Education through Entertainment (EE), Remote Voluntary Teaching (RVT), Connect Students around the World (CSAW) in 55 districts of Bangladesh including very remote areas. In the process, Dnet developed a multi-skilled team, necessary to establish computer labs and digital classrooms anywhere in Bangladesh, run those efficiently, and sustain those. Dnet has even established centers in a place with solar power, as there was no electricity.

Establishment of Computer Literacy Centers (CLCs) is a major CLP initiative. Other projects build and leverage on CLC infrastructure. When a donor wants to sponsor a CLC in a school, the Dnet team visits the school for a feasibility study, and shares the results with the donor. If the school is found to have the necessary infrastructure and support system; and the donor wishes to proceed with the establishment of a center, the procurement procedure to set up a computer lab and/or a smart class room starts. The team sends the computers and other materials to the school and visit for setting up.

Dnet expertise made possible to set up CLCs and SCRs in the rural areas of Bangladesh. Regular follow up by the Dnet team ensures that any hardware, software, maintenance and training issues are promptly addressed. Members of the Dnet team visit every center at least once a year to monitor how the center is running. Dnet trains the teachers on how to maintain the hardware for longer life, and help them to trouble shoot. If any major problem with any of the devices is reported, Dnet ensures the repairing (and if needed, replacement) of the devices. Sometimes the issues are solved with the locally available services. For more involved problems, the devices are taken to Dnet Office.

CLP and Dnet run an intensive program to train teachers for creating learning environments and effective classrooms. Teachers are trained indifferent areas, such as conducting class in a CLC and a SCR, basic hardware maintenance, how to coordinate remotely taught classes, how to conduct on-line classes and education through entertainment sessions, and last but not the least how to teach students through digital and offline pedagogy training. To date, 1507 teachers have been trained.

Dnet played a key role when the digital curriculum was developed in consultation with computer scientists and educators, and in its subsequent modification and expansion. Dnet team was actively involved in developing "Esho Computer Shikhi," a student learning manual for implementation of the curriculum. Three editions of the manual have been published to upgrade the contents and keep it up to date with recent developments. A fourth edition is being planned. "Teachers Guide," a separate manual for teachers will also be upgraded.

To make computer literacy training interactive, Dnet introduced the "Let's Cheer, Do, Share" model that involves doing icebreaking activities during the first 20 minutes of a session, middle 50 minutes of learning following the curriculum under the guidance of teachers, and the last 20 minutes reviewing and reflecting on the lesson of the day.

During COVID-19 the government instructed the teachers to offer online classes. However, the teachers commonly did not have any prior training on how to conduct on-line classes. Dnet took the initiative to train the teachers on how to take online classes, how to make videos using relevant applications and share on social media platform, and how to make digital contents.

During this pandemic, 103 teachers were trained on-line and 27 teachers received face-to-face training on e-Learning. These teachers hail from 31 districts. Seven new CLCs, and 12 SCRs were established during this period; and 4 classrooms were set up for distant teaching.

Dnet and CLP activities developed significantly over the years and now education is a flagship program of Dnet. British Council in Dhaka started collaborating with Dnet in 2012. They liked CLP program and sponsored 15 CLCs and 50 SCRs. Next, British Council implemented another program titled 'English and ICT in after School Clubs' in 10 schools, five of those being CLP project schools. More recently, British Council signed an agreement with Dnet for implementing a project titled 'English and Digital for Girls' Education (EDGE),' that aims to improve the life prospects of adolescent girls in the socio-economically marginalized communities in Bangladesh. Dnet will implement this project in CLP schools. Dnet is planning to involve more schools, more partners and donors.

However, there are some challenges in implementation of these activities. Sometimes it is found that some teachers are not motivated enough to teach the students. Sometimes the devices are not taken care of by the school authority. Dnet keeps regular communication with the teachers and the school authority to take care of the devices. Despite the challenges, the program is currently running throughout the country, specifically in 85 supported schools. Dnet's journey with CLP has been a pleasant one, and we look forward to continued fruitful partnership for empowerment of the underprivileged students in rural Bangladesh.
