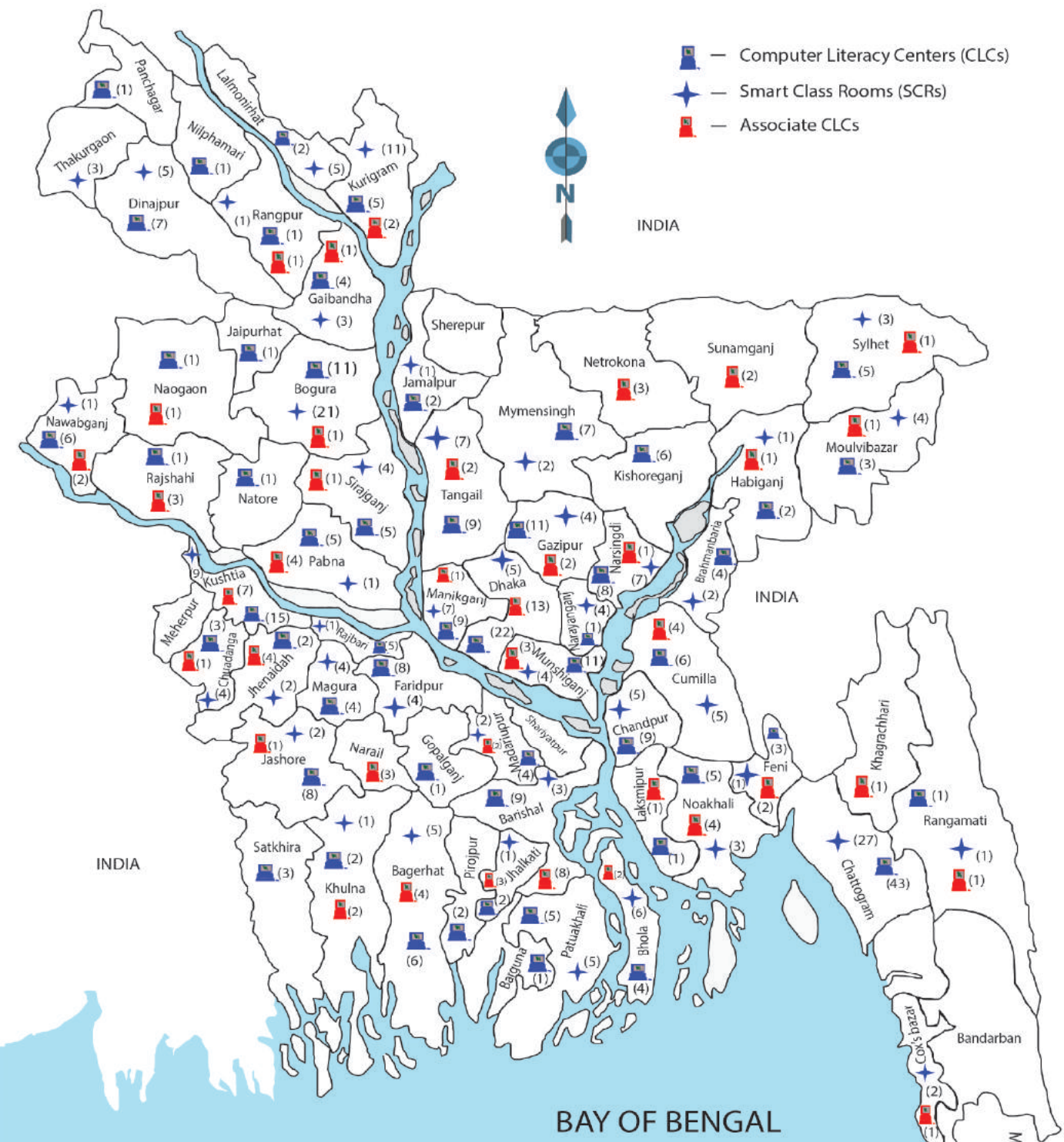

## Computer Literacy Program for the Underprivileged (2004 -2023)

### *Reaching the Outreach*

Computer Literacy Program for the Underprivileged (CLP) debuted nineteen years ago with the mission of “*Empowering underprivileged youths of Bangladesh through computer literacy and technology aided education.*” Outreach, broadly defined as the pursuit to provide services to people who may not have access to those otherwise, was the principal focus. The reasons for paucity of access are varied and may include socio-economic conditions, geographical location, knowledge and information base, to name a few. CLP’s targeted population was rural students, and enhancing their educational experience through infusion of modern technology tools was the intended service.

The first step was to bridge the *digital divide* that had permeated different spheres of life, but most alarmingly in the field of education. There was the digital divide between a student in a developed country and one in a developing country, such as Bangladesh. Digital divide existed between a student in a remote village and one in a big city in Bangladesh, between one from an educated, well-to-do family and another from a less fortunate family. CLP started establishing *Computer Literacy Centers* (CLCs) in educational institutions, trained teachers, developed a curriculum and instructional guide “*Esho Computer Shikhi*” to make computers available and promote their use. Emphasis has been and continues to be on establishing CLCs in rural areas where access to computers was non-existent.

With CLCs as basic outreach and technology platform, CLP has continually developed innovative programs that focus on enhancing the educational experience of students and thus goes way beyond the perception of CLP in some spheres as a provider of computers only. CLP launched the *Smart Classrooms* (SCRs) initiative in 2009 to introduce elements of modern educational technology and multi-media modes of instruction and learning in rural schools. Other CLP initiatives, such as *Education through Entertainment* (2016), *Connect Students Around the World* (2017), *Remote Voluntary Teaching* (2018) and *Expert Guided Learning* (2022) deliver innovative and enriching curricular and extra-curricular services to underprivileged students who may not otherwise have access to those services. CLP’s Remote Voluntary Teaching (RVT) initiative involves volunteer teachers from abroad and/or within Bangladesh teaching students remotely using the communication technology resources of a SCR. RVT enabled an orphanage in Bangladesh to run over 30 classes per week during the COVID-19 pandemic when regular schools were shut down, which may be considered an ideal example of an outreach activity done right.

CLP’s most recent initiative, Expert Guided Learning (EGL) has the potential to overcome some important implementation limitations of RVT and use the lessons taught by an expert instructor (or a group of experts) to teach numerous students in different schools following their own schedule. An EGL-English course has already been developed and is being run in several schools under a pilot program. An EGL-Math course taught by a group of experts is currently being video recorded. CLP will run a pilot project in several schools next year to assess the efficacy of the approach. An office management course that provides hands-on training in using computers and the basics of information technology, skills that are in high demand in the job market, is also being prepared.

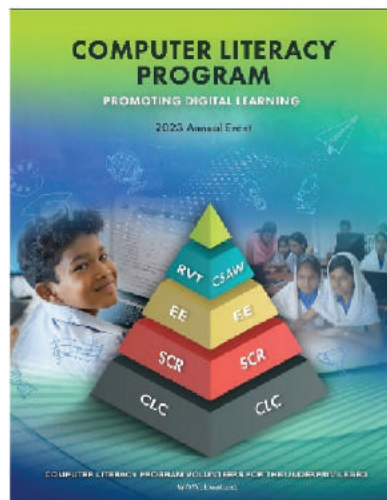
More recently, with sponsorship from a generous donor, CLP has started establishing CLCs and SCRs for the first time in several schools in the island district of Bhola, including Char Fasson upazila, thus extending its outreach activities in another remote area without any land connection.

## Tonight's Distinguished Speaker



*Dr. Shakil Ahmed is a retired quant hedge fund manager and senior Wall Street executive. He currently spends most of his time as a private investor. He is an Associate Fellow at Trumbull College, Yale University, is on the advisory board at Vatic Investments and a member of the board at Zarca Interactive, Inc. Dr. Ahmed was the founder and Chief Executive Officer of the hedge fund Princeton Alpha. Until February, 2013, he was the Global Head of Market Making at Citi and served on the Executive Committee of the Equities Division. Prior to that, he also served as the Global Head of Quantitative Strategies and sat on the management committee of Citi Alternative Investments. He joined Citi in early 2008 and left at the end of February, 2013, to form Princeton Alpha. Prior to joining Citi, Dr. Ahmed spent fourteen years at Morgan Stanley in the Process Driven Trading group, the main proprietary trading business at the firm. For many of those years, he was the head of the business. He had retired from day-to-day responsibilities in December, 2006 and served as a Senior Advisor to the firm until early 2008, when his former boss and then incoming CEO at Citi, Vikram Pandit, invited him to come to Citi. Dr. Ahmed has a Ph.D. in Computer Science from Yale University, where his thesis was on parallel processing (1994). He also has M.S. and M.Phil. degrees in the same field from Yale. His undergraduate degree was from the University of California, Berkeley, where he graduated early with high honors and high distinction in Computer Science. Shakil grew up in Vienna, Austria, where he attended the Vienna International School.*



*Motasim Billah is a biochemist with MSc in Biochemistry from Dhaka University and PhD in Biochemistry from Birmingham University, England. Dr. Billah has spent nearly 4 decades working for 2 major pharmaceutical companies (Schering-Plough, now part of Merck, and Bristol-Myers Squibb) in various capacities, discovering and developing drugs for cancers and inflammatory diseases such as asthma. Dr. Billah authored over 110 peer-reviewed publications and sat on the Editorial Boards of the prestigious Biochemical Journal (London) and Journal of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (Bethesda, Maryland). While at Schering-Plough, Dr. Billah was the recipient of three awards for outstanding scientific achievements and contributed to the discovery of over a dozen drug candidates. His current focus at Bristol-Myers Squibb is regulatory science*

## Expert Guided Learning in 2023

This article provides an update on the Expert Guided Learning (EGL) initiative that was launched in 2022 to bring outstanding instruction by an expert teacher to any technologically ready classroom anywhere. EGL–English, the first course developed under the initiative comprised of 20 lessons that focused on vocabulary, proper pronunciation, and carrying out simple conversations in English. It was very well received by the students and teachers at the school that participated in the development of the course (for further details please consult, page 16 of [CLP Magazine 2022.pdf \(clpweb.org\)](#)). The course has been introduced in 17 schools across Bangladesh under a pilot project for evaluation of the efficacy of the approach.

CLP is now developing an EGL–Math course for sixth grade students in Bangladesh. Before getting into the details of the new course, a brief review of the scope and rationale behind EGL courses is in order.

The EGL initiative grew out of CLP’s considerably successful Remote Voluntary Teaching (RVT) program that enabled volunteer teachers from home and abroad (such as the US and Australia) teach remote classes using the communication technology resources of smart classrooms (SCRs) and videoconferencing platforms such as Zoom, Google Hangouts and Skype. Volunteer instructors have been teaching courses in Biology, Chemistry, Creative Writing, English, Mathematics and Physics to students in a few rural schools in Bangladesh. However, several factors impede wider implementation of the RVT model and technical bottlenecks may limit communication. First, scaling up of RVT following the current ‘one teacher teaching one class model’ would require many volunteer teachers that may not be readily available. Second, sizeable efforts are required for coordinating each remote class. Managing and coordinating the efforts of many volunteer teachers in many schools is a formidable challenge. Third, the time difference between the location of a volunteer instructor (in the US or Australia, for example) and students in Bangladesh restricts class timing and number of classes that may be offered in a SCR per day. Finally, the availability, quality, dependability, and cost of the Internet connection may be of considerable concern. It is not uncommon to miss a class due to inadequate Internet connection (for example, please see Mahir Majid’s article in this issue).

The motivation behind introducing the EGL courses is to alleviate these limitations and use the exemplary lessons by a master instructor to teach numerous students at different schools following their own schedules and timetables. This is accomplished by producing instructional materials in the manner outlined below. An expert teacher (ET) teaches a course remotely following a syllabus and a detailed lesson plan. A local teacher (LT) assists the ET during the class period as required. Every class is video recorded. The recorded video is then edited to erase the classroom voices and noises and only the ET’s voice remains on the tape. This edited videotape serves as the instruction material for subsequent delivery of the course. Multiple copies of each video may be made as required. For teaching a class using a recorded video in a smart classroom, a LT plays the video and coordinates the lesson and actions in sync with the ET



students in the class, conducts discussions and monitors students' answers to questions posed by the ET on the videotape, as required. This is how the EGL-English course was developed and deployed.

The EGL-Math course is being developed along the same line as the EGL-English but also with some notable differences. It is following the curriculum, syllabus, and the textbook for sixth grade students by the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB). The book has 12 chapters that cover the concepts of numbers, integers, fractions, two-dimensional and three-dimensional objects, information investigation and analysis, prime factors, measurement of length, linear equations, unitary method, ratio and percentages etc. CLP is collaborating with Uddipon Badar Shamsu Bidya Niketon (UBSBN) at Boitpur, Bagerhat for developing this course. One of the teachers at UBSBN will be teaching the course following the textbook. Once the teacher finishes teaching a chapter (which may require several classes), an expert teacher will remotely review the chapter highlighting the key concepts and presenting interesting examples and applications that may make math interesting to the students and inspire a few to become a mathematician. Instead of a single expert, 9 experts will be involved in expounding the wonders of mathematical concepts with each expert being responsible for one or more of the chapters. The classes will be recorded, edited, and processed for use as instructional materials following the procedure used for developing the EGL-English course.



Nineteen of the planned twenty-three classes (one shown in the photo above) have already been recorded. The UBSBN teacher runs a short evaluation of the expert guided class by the students. Here the goal is to assess the students' learning of the material and effectiveness of the EGL class.

While the development of the EGL-Math course is still in progress, we are cautiously optimistic of its efficacy, which will also help plan other EGL courses.

## **My Experience as a CLP Remote Volunteer Teacher**

On March 13th, 2022, my face was projected for the first time on a large screen to a class of 15 Bangladeshi students attending the Kofejan Nezi and Hazi Niamot Ullah High School in Bheramara, Kushtia. I just started teaching an online class in English as a young volunteer of the Computer Literacy Program (CLP). Joining the Zoom meeting from my room in New Jersey, I held my breath as the images of students popped up on my computer screen. Since I never spoke Bengali to anyone outside my family before, I was extremely anxious about whether the students would be able to understand me. But before I knew it, I was engaged in a full-on conversation with my students where they enthusiastically shared their names, hobbies, and career plans, following my initial introduction. From there, the rest of that first day sailed smoothly and I successfully taught my first grammar lesson on singular vs. plural nouns which the students grasped promptly.



For the next few months, I continued meeting the students through weekly classes. Unfortunately, these classes began around 11:00 PM in New Jersey to accommodate for the time difference with Bangladesh and I was often tired before the start of class. But thankfully, this did not turn out to be a significant problem as the presence of the eager student faces on my screen when class started immediately brought my energy up and revitalized me, allowing me to teach the class confidently and engage students in the lesson for that day. prepared lessons on a variety of topics including grammar, verb usage, spelling, and story-telling techniques. It was exciting to witness the students' improvement in spoken English each class and I was impressed by how fluently the students implemented my lessons. Occasionally, classes would be canceled due to connection issues from the school and two weeks would pass before I saw my students again. But despite the learning gap, the students to my astonishment retained almost everything I taught them two weeks ago and it was easy to keep moving forward with them. The kids were diligent and showed determination in each class to improve their English, which I admired greatly. But there was something else about those students that made me even more proud.

By my sixth class, I noticed two students seemed to struggle with understanding my lessons and they tended to copy their classmate's past answers. Since these classes were held virtually, there was very little I could do to address the problem. But to my relief, a group of three students also noticed their classmates' struggles and did not hesitate to spend extra time aiding them with understanding the course material and crafting their answers to my prompts. This kindness and care to help one another was present among other students in the class and it was wonderful seeing the students work together to improve. Such collaboration is essential in solving problems and I loved that my students already harnessed that character content.



My time with the students was above all a wonderful opportunity for me to explore my roots. As a Bangladeshi-American high school student who frequently visited Bangladesh during summer vacation, learning about Bengali culture directly through interaction with Bangladeshi high school students was exciting and I was thrilled to hear about student life in Bangladesh. I will always cherish my time with the hardworking students at the Kofejan Nezi and Hazi Niamot Ullah High School and wish nothing but the best for them in their future endeavors.

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## My visit to Uddipon Badar Shamsu Bidya Niketon

One of the more enjoyable high lights of my retired life has been teaching physics to students in grades 9 and 10 of Uddipon Badar Shamsu Bidya Niketon (UBSBN) in Boitpur, Bagerhat. I have been teaching this course remotely for four years now. While teaching each batch of students for approximately two years, I develop a close bond with them. Each year the students plead with me to visit them at their school. I typically go to Bangladesh every year during winter . I stay almost entirely in Dhaka close to my relatives. While it takes roughly 24 hours to fly from New Jersey to Dhaka (roughly 8,000 miles or about 13,000 kilometers), going to Boitpur from Dhaka (a little over 200 kilometers) was a whole day 's journey each way , which I avoided. It took that long primarily because of the ferry ride across the tumultuous Padma River. All that changed in 2022 when the Padma Bridge was opened. So, in 2023, I agreed to visit UBSBN.

It is roughly a 4-hour drive. To avoid Dhaka 's maddening traffic, we started early , around 7:30 AM. Winter mornings in Bangladesh is usually shrouded by fog. We observed fog even at 10 AM when we were on the 6.15 kilometers long Padma Bridge. I had hoped to have a good look at the bridge and the river, but fog did not allow a clear view. I made a mental note to view the bridge on my way back.



We reached the school at about 12 Noon. I was pleasantly impressed with both the infrastructure and the wide-eyed enthusiasm of the students. Mr. Dipankar Pal, the headmaster, and the Mr. Subrata Mukherjee, the manager of the trust that runs UBSBN took me around for a tour of the school. Given that the school has been built and is run by a family, it was something

to behold. The school has two buildings. One happens to be a storm shelter built by the government and has been used as such. The school has a beautiful campus, meticulously maintained in a remote village . Most impressive was the Computer Literacy Center (CLC) and the two Smart Classrooms (SCRs). I also looked at the general class rooms, the school library and a neat little museum that displays artifacts of academic interest and crafts developed by students.

I was trying understand how did the school management succeed in maintaining a clearly visible cleanliness typically absent in village schools in Bangladesh. Garbage cans were present throughout the school with one conspicuously designed as a bottle. Clearly, management must walk the extra mile to provide the necessary resources. Additionally, social consciousness to the benefits of clean environment must have been upon everyone at the school as exemplified by the habitual use of garbage cans in



buildings. In addition to environment friendly aura, the solar power must go a long way to meet the power demand of the school and keeping the internet connectivity, a vital element of the school's computer facilities.

Typically CLCs are equipped with four computers, yet here at UBSBN, the CLC had 30 computers. One of the SCRs is very familiar to me as that is the one, I use to teach my physics class every Monday night (10 PM my time and 8 AM at the school). However, all this time I looked at the room through the eye of my camera looking from the front facing the students. Now I had a view of the monitor that the students use to look at me. Interesting perspective! The SCR has a large screen monitor and audio-visual equipment for conducting remote classes.



Before I came to the school, I had sent a gift bag for each of my students that included a vernier caliper. I found that most students struggled a bit with the vernier caliper. Mr. Pal had distributed the giftbags to the students and handed me the photo of the students with gift bags.

There was another pleasant surprise for me.

One of my students from two years ago, Juthi Akhter, has kept in touch with me via Facebook. She was a good student and graduated from UBSBN with distinction., I had requested her to come to the school on that day. It was a pleasure to see her for the first time in person. Clearly, she frequents her childhood school. We chatted about our physics class and her class mates. She updated me about her career since she left UBSBN. She is pursuing medical science at a nearby college. Like most teachers, I felt a quiet satisfaction to see one of my students blooming into a responsible member of society. The accompanying photo of Juthi Akhter with me (far right), also shows Shroyo Shamsuddin (2<sup>nd</sup> from left), a remote youth volunteer in the picture. This young volunteer teaches creative English writing remotely from Melbourne, Australia.

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## **CLP: A Journey towards Digital Bangladesh**

I decided to leave my policy research career in a leading thinktank in Bangladesh and join social entrepreneurship back in 2003. One day I received a call from Professor Zafar Iqbal. He told me that a group of Bangladeshi scientists in US is eager to work in Bangladesh for reducing digital divide and provide a holistic solution in digital literacy in non-urban area of Bangladesh. He asked me whether I am interested in exploring this opportunity. First of all, receiving a call from Professor Zafar Iqbal itself was a matter of thrill, and a kind of recognition of my works. He trusted me and introduced me to Dr. M Farooque, a fuel cell scientist from New Jersey. I called him the next day and Dr. Farooque briefed me about the idea. My work was related to exploring the connection between digital technology and development. And it was a perfect opportunity for us to experiment. Yes, experiment, because such model did not exist at that time, and we did not have prior knowledge about how to implement such program. I agreed to start working on it. Dr. Farooque named the project in a pretty straight forward and simple way: Computer Literacy Program, in short CLP. The journey began. It is almost 20 years now and CLP is thriving.

What was in it that CLP is still working? In last 20 years, we have become Digital Bangladesh. We talk about the fourth industrial revolution; we talk about artificial intelligence and some may think is there any need for such a kind of program? The answer is both yes and no. No, because we need to teach coding even at primary school level, we do robotics Olympiad, we do space challenge hackathon and many more. Probably, that is the trend. The answer is yes, because thanks to programs like CLP, basic computer literacy is being achieved and that allows us to go for next level development. The answer is yes, because, as of today there is a digital divide in basic computer literacy despite many large-scale programs implemented by the government. The program like CLP augments the mainstream activities.

CLP is still functioning because the model was designed with systems thinking and design thinking approach. In 2004, these terms were largely unknown, however the Bangladeshi scientific community in US applied those concepts in design. We think that many Bangladeshis living abroad have lost connection to their mother land and are not aware of the ground reality. But CLP design does not support that perception.

CLP design included learning by doing curriculum and text book, which is the foundation. The design included a functional computer lab, sponsored by an expatriate Bangladeshi, many of whom went to those schools, where the computer labs were set up. There was a system of trouble shooting, so that computers remain functional all the time, with 24 hours on the spot support service. We needed teachers for running the program, but sometimes students learn faster than teachers. Thus, there was a combination of teacher-student lesson model. Teachers teach and one or two students assist in the learning process. A two-week teachers' training program was introduced. How to make sure that teachers spare time for the computer teaching forgoing tuition? A system of compensation was introduced. How to ensure that the program is running, and investment is giving result? There is a robust system of monitoring, by the sponsors themselves,

by the CLP New Jersey team as well as by the team on the ground. One of the key ingredients of success is passion and belief for a cause, both of which possessed by the team.

CLP did not remain stagnant; innovation is a continuous process for CLP. The next idea was facilitating teachers in learning subjects for which teachers training capacity is inadequate. Also, how to augment the learning process in the classroom to be more interesting and effective. The idea's name was 'smart classroom.' There were two parts to the program: one for teachers, the other for students in the classroom. A learning management system was developed with two components: one for teachers and the other for the students. Teachers can access a repository of content, comprising of multimedia on various topics in line with the national curriculum as well as guideline for the flow of the class teaching. For using multimedia in the classroom, a laptop was available for teachers with a large screen monitor, solar power system for ensuring uninterrupted experience where electricity was a challenge. The choice of monitor was deliberate as multimedia projector repair and maintenance is a big issue and at time one single bulb of the projector was too costly and often schools were reluctant to replace one when it gone. Pedagogy was upgraded to andragogy, where other techniques and tools were not replaced by power point presentation, rather small videos augmented the mainstream methods of teaching-learning.

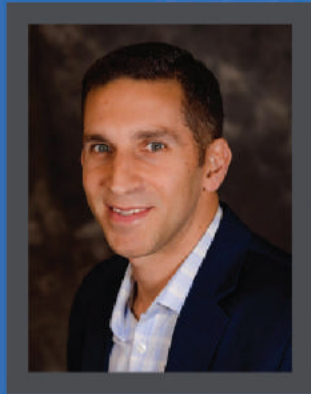
The smart classroom was implemented with sponsorship of expatriate Bangladeshis. Subsequently, British Council and Bank Asia also joined the bandwagon. Bangladesh Computer Council also came forward with support and public-private partnership facilitated establishing more smart classrooms. It is the predecessor of large-scale government funded multi-media classroom project. CLP inspired the program like Shaikh Russel Digital Lab in schools by the government.

The other innovation of CLP was English teaching and Education Through Entertainment program.

Looking back and seeing the outcome of the CLP programs, I think it is time to document the whole program design in a way, which allows enthusiasts in other countries to replicate this model. CLP may think of going global. The expatriate community has that resource and network to pull together the right partnerships.

I am proud to be associated with the CLP and happy to see the outcome of the program, which changed the lives of thousands of students and teachers. I believe CLP, with many of its initiatives, laid the foundation of Digital Bangladesh architecture. I met so many good souls in the process of implementation of the program and learnt many aspects of how to remain focused despite all odds.

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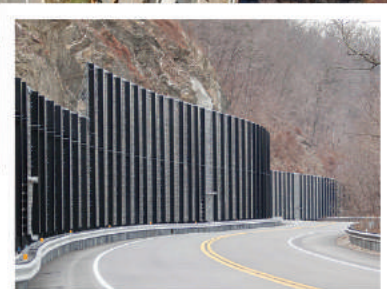
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
